Rule 6, Section 6, of the Supreme Court Rules Concerning the State Bar of Michigan provides that any vacancy in the membership of the Assembly shall be filled by appointment of the Assembly's membership upon nomination of the remaining representatives from the judicial circuit or, if there are none, the State Bar recognized local bar association in the judicial circuit. The Assembly's Nominating & Awards Committee is responsible for soliciting and presenting nominations to the Assembly.

All interim appointees will serve for the April 2018 and September 2018 meetings only. To fill the remaining term thereafter, an interim appointee will need file an election petition and stand for election.

An interim appointee to a vacancy for an existing term expiring in 2018 who wishes to continue serving on the Assembly must file an election petition with the State Bar of Michigan, as provided for in Rule 6, Section 4 of the Supreme Court Rules Concerning the State Bar of Michigan, by April 30, 2018 to seek election for a three-year term and the person elected shall take his or her seat immediately.

Similarly, an interim appointee to a vacancy for an existing term expiring in 2019 or 2020 who wishes to continue serving on the Assembly must file an election petition with the State Bar of Michigan, as provided for in Rule 6, Section 4 of the Supreme Court Rules Concerning the State Bar of Michigan, by April 30, 2018 to seek election for the remaining term of the seat to which the person was appointed and the person elected shall take his or her seat immediately.
