Section Publications: In addition to the publication of the longstanding *Michigan IT Lawyer* newsletter (formerly the *Michigan Computer Lawyer*), the Section began publishing a new *e-newsletter*. Both newsletters are slated to be published on a bi-monthly basis, so the Section averages a publication each month. Hopefully this increased frequency of publication can be sustained into the future.
