In order to retain the Assembly seat for a new three-year term (expiring 2008), interim appointees MUST submit a completed Assembly Petition to the State Bar of Michigan by April 30, 2006.

Individuals appointed to fill vacancies with terms expiring at the close of the 2007 or 2008 Annual Meeting are interim appointees whose terms are only effective for the 2005-2006 Bar year. The remainder of the term (ie. 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 Bar year) will be open for election. Interim appointees MUST submit a completed Assembly Petition to the State Bar of Michigan by April 30, 2006 in order to retain the Assembly seat through 2007 or 2008.
