FACE OF JUSTICE PROGRAM



The Face of Justice program allows high school students to network with legal professionals. The program, based on a National Association of Women Judges program, is organized by the Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Committee of the State Bar of Michigan.

The program's primary focus is a "jet-mentoring" component designed to give high school students the opportunity to interact with a variety of legal professionals. Students get a few minutes with the attorneys, judges, and law enforcement officials in attendance to ask questions, hear about why people choose particular paths, and the preparation needed to pursue a career in the law.

In the past, we worked with the Michigan Supreme Court Hall of Justice to offer tours of the courtrooms and interactive learning center. We also worked with the Southeast Michigan Urban League and event sponsor Comcast to transport Detroit-area students to the 36th District Court for tours of its courtrooms while in session and then to Wayne County Community College to learn about higher education opportunities. Collaborations with different organizations and groups as sponsors and help from legal professionals providing mentoring have been the key to the program's success.


