
## FOURTH AMENDMENT WORD SEARCH - Answer Sheet

The clues and words are based on the Fourth Amendment of the United States Constitution and §11 of the Michigan Constitution. This Word Search will allow Michigan residents to compare the United States Constitution to the Michigan Constitution.

In order to determine the words to find, you will need to figure out what word is missing. After you determined the missing word, search for it below.



Fourth <u>Amendment</u> of the United <u>States</u> Constitution – The right of the <u>people</u> to be secure in their persons, <u>houses</u>, papers, and effects against unreasonable <u>searches</u> and <u>seizures</u>, shall not be violated, an no <u>Warrants</u> shall issue, but upon <u>probable</u> cause, supported by Oath or <u>affirmation</u>, and particularly <u>describing</u> the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.

Section 11 of the <u>Michigan</u> Constitution – The person, houses, <u>papers</u> and possessions of every person shall be secure from unreasonable searches and seizures. No warrant to search any place or to seize any person or <u>things</u> shall issue without describing them, nor without probable <u>cause</u>, supported by <u>oath</u> or affirmation. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to bar from <u>evidence</u> in any <u>criminal</u> proceeding any narcotic <u>drug</u>, firearm, bomb, <u>explosive</u> or any other dangerous <u>weapon</u>, seized by a peace officer outside the curtilage of any <u>dwelling</u> house in this state.
