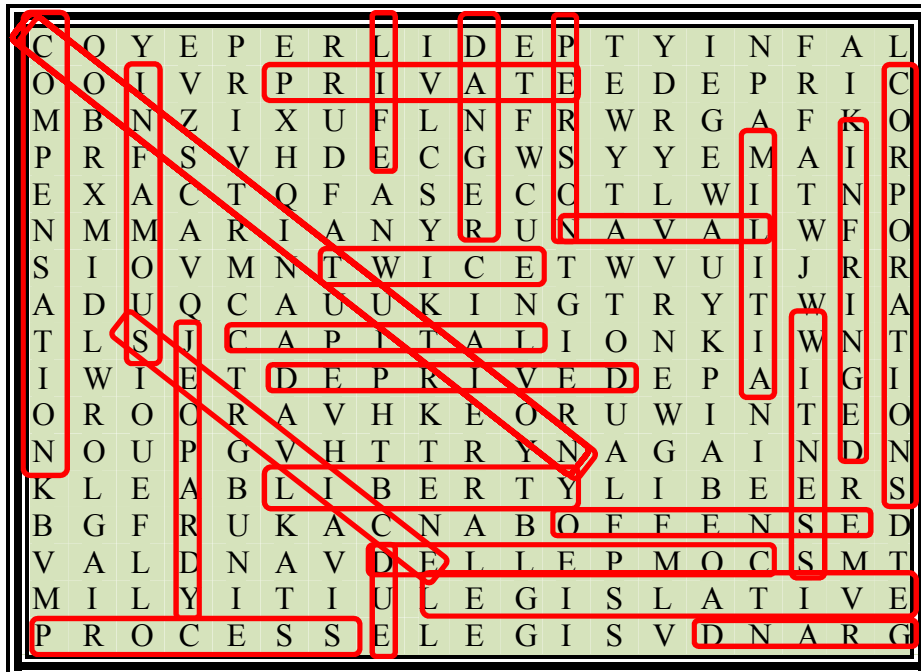


FIFTH AMENDMENT

WORD SEARCH - Answer Sheet

The clues and words are based on the Fifth Amendment of the United States Constitution and §15 and §17 of the Michigan Constitution. This Word Search will allow Michigan residents to compare the United States Constitution to the Michigan Constitution. In order to determine the words to find, you will need to figure out what word is missing. After you determined the missing word, search for it below.



Fifth Amendment of the United States Constitution: No person shall held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the Militia, when in actual service in time of War or public danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.

Section 15 of the Michigan Constitution: No person shall be subject for the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy. . . .

Section 17 of the Michigan Constitution: No person shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty or property, without due process of law. The right of all individuals, firms, corporations and voluntary associations to fair and just treatment in the course of legislative and executive investigations and hearings shall not be infringed.
