The State of Michigan allows bar applicants to transfer a Multistate Bar Examination score into the State of Michigan provided that (1) the applicant passed the entire bar examination of which that MBE was a part, (2) the applicant took the bar examination of which the MBE was a part within the last three years and (3) the jurisdiction which administered that MBE affords a reciprocal transfer right to Michigan residents seeking the transfer of a MBE score to the bar of that jurisdiction.
