<u>SB 0386</u> (Casperson) Traffic control; violations; prohibition on courts taking under advisement certain offenses committed by a person while operating a commercial motor vehicle or a person licensed to operate a commercial motor vehicle while operating a noncommercial motor vehicle; reinstate. Amends sec. 732 of <u>1949</u> <u>PA 300</u> (MCL <u>257.732</u>).

This position falls within the following Keller-permissible category:

Keller-permissible explanation:

The committee agreed that this bill was Keller permissible in its affecting the functioning of the courts, as it deals with the diversionary programs available through problem-solving courts. The State Court Administrative Office testimony before legislative committee notes that "the importance of non-CDL driver offense delay, etc. to the success of problem solving courts, cannot be underestimated. It is the main incentive for an offender to join the program and not re-offend."
