ELDER LAW & DISABILITY RIGHTS SECTION Public Policy Position SB 713

The Elder Law & Disability Rights Section is a voluntary membership section of the State Bar of Michigan, comprised of 1,270 members. The Elder Law & Disability Rights Section is not the State Bar of Michigan and the position expressed herein is that of the Elder Law & Disability Rights Section only and not the State Bar of Michigan. To date, the State Bar does not have a position on this item.

The Elder Law & Disability Rights Section has a public policy decision-making body with 19 members. On February 3, 2018, the Section adopted its position after discussion and vote at a scheduled meeting. 11 members voted in favor of the Section's position on SB 713, 2 members voted against this position, 0 members abstained, 6 members did not vote.

The Elder Law & Disability Rights Section Supports the Concept of SB 713, but Opposes the Bill as Currently Drafted.

Explanation:

The Elder Law & Disability Rights Section supports SB713 in its overall concept that isolation of vulnerable adults is a serious issue that requires legislative attention. However, the Section opposes the current written form of SB713 because more revisions are necessary to ensure that citizens will not be harmed by it, that provisions and procedures do not adversely compromise existing law (EPIC), and that more input from various stakeholders (courts, probate practitioners, adult protective services, etc.) is needed.

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
