## Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

HB 4480 amends factor (j) of the Child Custody Act to clarify that a parent's willingness to facilitate and encourage a close parent child relationship with the other parent might be inappropriate where if the child needs to be protected from an abusive parent. The Family Law Section believes that this is already the standard for this factor and that the child custody factors should not be modified absent a compelling need. The Family Law Section opposes this bill.
