<u>SB 0351</u> (Jones) Family law; marriage and divorce; contacting a party to a divorce action; prohibit for a certain time period. Amends <u>1961 PA 236</u> (MCL <u>600.101</u> - <u>600.9947</u>) by adding sec. 914.

Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

SB 351 protects victims of domestic violence by preventing direct solicitations of legal services until 21 days after a summons is issued in a divorce action. This allows the victim an opportunity to execute a safety plan, arrange for service in a manner likely to reduce risks, and serve protective orders along with the complaint for divorce before the defendant learns of the action from a direct solicitation. The Family Law Section believes that the victim must be allowed a reasonable time to achieve service. The Family Law Section supports this bill.

Keller-permissible explanation:

This bill limits for a brief period when an attorney may engage in direct solicitations in divorce actions. It also increases the availability of legal services to victims of domestic violence who would otherwise not file an action if they believe the defendant would receive advance notice of the action.
