Support with recommended amendments

#### Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

The State Bar of Michigan Marijuana Law Section support the bill with the following recommended amendments:

- 1. The bill be amended to include a qualified forensic pharmacologist, criminal defense lawyer and prosecuting attorney on the committee.
- 2. The bill be amended to require the committee comment on the current law regarding driving and marijuana to wit: 257.625(8) and make scientifically supported recommendations for elimination, amendment and/or replacement
- 3. The bill be amended to not require the committee to recommend a scientifically supported THC concentration if one does not exist.
