### Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

The bill grants broad immunity to pharmacists who refuse to dispense medication regardless of the type or amount. The only requirement is that the pharmacist has a belief that the client will use the medication for an illegitimate purpose, even if they have no evidence to support that belief. The section opposes the bill based on the fact that it puts individuals at risk of discrimination without providing a clear public benefit. It could also lead to injuries or worse if legitimate clients are wrongly denied needed medication.
