At its July 22, 2011 meeting, the State Bar of Michigan's Board of Commissioners voted to support HB 4327 provided that the two-way interactive technology is used instead of video recording. In the Board's consideration, it reviewed a recommendation from the State Bar's Criminal Jurisprudence and Practice Committee that noted the importance of using two-way interactive video testimony in order to preserve a defendant's constitutional right to confrontation.

However, the State Bar believes this subject matter is more properly handled within the jurisdiction of the Michigan Supreme Court. The State Bar has historically supported that such policy changes should be made in court rule or in rules of evidence.
