HB 4039 (Sheen) Family law; child support; option for tether in lieu of jail time for certain individuals with child support arrearage; provide for. Amends sec. 33 of 1982 PA 295 (MCL 552.633).

Position:

House Bill 4039, sponsored by Reps. Sheen, Hoogendyk, Drolet, Brandenburg, Pastor, Stakoe, Marleau, Elsenheimer, Shaffer, Hildenbrand, Pavlov and Gaffney and referred to Judiciary, adds electronic tether to sentencing options if a child support payer is found in contempt of court. The order must contain a provision "ordering the payer to be employed and pay child support" and require the payer to submit to electronic monitoring and to pay the costs of that monitoring. Council members expressed concerns that the costs of monitoring should not take precedence over the child support, and some worried that the full panoply of remedies can be invoked for fairly low arrearages, but overall the Council felt that an additional option for contempt remedies was beneficial, particularly in times of jail-overcrowding. The Family Law Council supports this bill.
