The bill is deserving of support as it allows for expunction of a record with no more than one felony and two misdemeanors. Often the less advantaged in society are charged with a multiple count complaint from one criminal transaction. Though their rehabilitation has been successful, the existence of a second count and hence a second conviction currently prohibit expunction of anything. This bill will instill some fairness in the process and has wide support from all sections with an interest in this subject.
