Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

The State Bar opposed a similar Bill during a previous legislative session on the ground that this was a subject that should be left to the Supreme Court to regulate under its authority over practice and procedure in the courts. The Committee supports that view. On the merits of the bill, the Committee is opposed to extending the exemption from jury service based on previous from 1 to 2 years, at least until a factual foundation is established that this would not cause problems with securing sufficient jurors in any courts, particularly in less populous areas.
