
FIFTH AMENDMENT WORD SEARCH - Answer Sheet

The clues and words are based on the Fifth Amendment of the United States Constitution and §15 and §17 of the Michigan Constitution. This Word Search will allow Michigan residents to compare the United States Constitution to the Michigan Constitution. In order to determine the words to find, you will need to figure out what word is missing. After you determined the missing word, search for it below.



Fifth Amendment of the United States <u>Constitution</u>: No person shall held to answer for a <u>capital</u>, or otherwise <u>infamous</u> crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a <u>Grand</u> Jury, except in cases arising in the land or <u>naval</u> forces, or in the <u>Militia</u>, when in actual <u>service</u> in time of War or public <u>danger</u>; nor shall any person be subject for the same <u>offense</u> to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a <u>witness</u> against himself, nor deprived of life, <u>liberty</u>, or property, without due <u>process</u> of law; nor shall <u>private</u> property be taken for public use, without just <u>compensation</u>.

Section 15 of the Michigan Constitution: No <u>person</u> shall be subject for the same offense to be <u>twice</u> put in jeopardy....

Section 17 of the Michigan Constitution: No person shall be <u>compelled</u> in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be <u>deprived</u> of <u>life</u>, liberty or property, without <u>due</u> process of law. The right of all individuals, firms, <u>corporations</u> and voluntary associations to fair and just treatment in the course of <u>legislative</u> and executive investigations and hearings shall not be <u>infringed</u>.
