# Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

HB 4844 requires the state to create a publicly accessible website to register Personal Protection Orders, and requires law enforcement agencies to enter PPOs on the public website at the same time as the PPOs are entered on the LEIN system. This violates a provision of the federal Violence Against Women Act, and would endanger federal funding for domestic violence programs. The registry might also have repercussions against victims of domestic violence. For example, a landlord, employer, child care provider, or others may not wish to do business with a victim of domestic violence for fear that the perpetrator may cause problems at their location. Judges may be more hesitant to issue PPOs if they knew that the orders would cause the restrained party public embarrassment. The Family Law Section opposes this bill.
