<u>HB 5766</u> (Cavanagh) Family law; marriage and divorce; name change upon solemnization of marriage; make genderneutral. Creates new act.

Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

HB 5766, the Michigan name equality act, allows either party to a marriage to change their middle or last by entering the new name into the spaces provided in the marriage license. The new middle or last name may be any combination of birth name or current names of either spouse. A marriage is an event in which people commonly take on new last names, without the necessity of applying for a name change. This bill allows the spouses flexibility to be gender neutral in deciding their married names. The Family Law Section supports this bill.
