<u>HB 4770</u> (Lipton) Law enforcement; reports; requirements for gaining access to motor vehicle accident reports within 30 days of the report being filed; establish, and provide penalties for noncompliance. Amends 1949 PA 300 (MCL 257.1 - 257.923) by adding sec. 503.
