#### Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

While the Section is in favor of reducing the prisoner population when it can be done without risk to public safety, we oppose an arbitrary cap on the population without exploring alternatives to incarceration, a review of Michigan's sentencing guidelines and practice, and the possibility of safely paroling those prisoners with a high probability of parole who are past their Earliest Release Dates or are parolable lifers. In addition, the Section opposes any efforts to partly privatize Michigan's prison system or pass additional costs to the counties, who may need state resources to provide rehabilitative programming or other services to state prisoners.
