Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

HB 4671 & 4672 provide an expedited process for attorneys to obtain acknowledgments of parentage. The state or local registrar must provide, without fee, a copy of an acknowledgment of paternity or a statement that the acknowledgment does not exist to an attorney or a court clerk employee within one day of receiving a request by telephone, mail or fax. Prioritizing these requests to this extent may force the state to deprioritize more essential services. In addition, it is the parties to the acknowledgment who are entitled to their records, not any person who claims to be an attorney. The records subject to disclosure include live birth records, records of still-birth, and acknowledgments of parentage, all of which should be subject to limited disclosure. The Family Law Section opposes these bills in their present form.
