Applying for a committee appointment is easy—simply visit the website and submit the requested information such as your résumé or curriculum vitae by April 25. You'll also receive an e-mail with a link to the electronic application in early April. As president-elect, I will review the applications starting in late May and make committee appointments by September 1. Due to the volume of applications we typically receive, we cannot guarantee everyone a position on every committee they wish to join; however if you apply, I promise to make every attempt to make the best use of your interest in helping the profession and the public.
