Of the four articles on administrative law in this theme issue, two discuss basic principles of administrative law: agency powers and judicial review. A third article addresses judicial independence in the context of administrative proceedings, an issue the Administrative Law Section has actively pursued, while the fourth article addresses intra-agency dispute resolution and a recent Michigan Court of Appeals decision finding that the Michigan Department of Consumer and Industry Services had standing to seek judicial review of a licensing determination by the Board of Medicine.
