Committee Activities

1. Proposed amendments to MCR. Rule 3.993 Guardianship of Minors. The Committee proposed rule amendments so that the rule complied with the Indian Child Welfare Act and the Michgian Indian Family Preservation Act. The Committee presented the rule proposal to the Representative Assembly and appeared on behalf of SBM before the Michigan Supreme Court at the public administrative hearing.
