Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

HB 4477 requires the Court of Appeals to facilitate service of a party who is subject to a protection order. Although it is important to continue protections for victims when a case is on appeal, the bill doesn't provide any mechanism for the Court of Appeals to discern the protected party's address, rendering the process unworkable. The Family Law Section opposes the bill until that issue is resolved.
