#### Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

The State Bar of Michigan Animal Law Section opposes SB 146. SB 146 would erode protections for large carnivores provided by the Large Carnivore Act by, for example, exempting some organizations from some of the requirements of the Large Carnivore Act and providing permission to breed large carnivores to certain organizations. SB 146 would also place additional requirements on shelters in possession of a large carnivore for more than 45 days, although it can often take much longer to find a suitable long-term placement for a large carnivore.
