The Animal Law Section opposes this bill. We propose that the sentence beginning in line 4 of page 1 stating "[i]f a dog is required..." be deleted, and the sentence beginning in line 9 of page 1 stating "[o]n receiving from the country treasurer..." be deleted. We also oppose (3), which allows a sheriff to kill an unlicensed dog if he or she determines that the dog is a threat to public safety, and (2), which requires a sheriff to seize any unlicensed dog identified by the county treasurer.
