Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

SB 285 extends neglect or cruelty prohibitions to a breeder or pet shop operator, enhances graduated penalties for animal neglect or cruelty based on the number of animals involved and/or the number of prior convictions, establishes a felony penalty for breeders and/or pet shop operators with five or more prior convictions, allows a court to include at least five years of probation as part of a sentence for a conviction involving 25 or more animals or three or more prior convictions and establishes first, second and third degrees of killing and torture of an animal and increases maximum penalties for first and second degrees. SB 286 revises the sentencing guidelines for animal

neglect or cruelty and scoring requirements for several offense variables which will provide for potentially increased sentences. The animal law section fully supports these bills as they will provide prosecutors and the courts the tools necessary to effectively charge and punish those convicted of an offense against an animal.
