The Section supports HB 5552 with these modifications:

- A) The bill should be made effective January 1, 2014.
- B) In the provisions related to trusts, the term "settlor" be changed wherever that term appears in MCL 211.27a to "transferor," with the possible exception of MCL 211.27a(6)(d)(ii), MCL 211.27a(6)(e)(ii), and MCL 211.27a(6)(u), so that it is clear that the exemption from the transfer law is based on the relationship of the distributee or new beneficiary of the trust to the prior "sole beneficiary."

The Section supports the legislation, but believes that there are loopholes that need to be closed in order for the legislation to achieve the desired aims.
