Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

SB 981 is part of a package of bills designed to combat domestic violence. This bill protects victims of domestic violence by preventing direct solicitations of legal services until 30 days after proof of service is filed in a divorce complaint. This allows the victim an opportunity to serve protective orders along with the complaint for divorce. The Family Law Section believes that the victim must be allowed a reasonable time to achieve service. The Family Law Section supports this bill.
