**SB 891** (Hardiman) Family law; child support; collection duties for certain state departments; establish. Amends title & secs. 1, 3, 13 & 28 of <u>1941 PA 122</u> (MCL <u>205.1</u> et seq.) & repeals <u>1927 PA 375</u> (MCL <u>14.131</u> - <u>14.134</u>).

### **Position:**

SB 891 introduced by Sens. Hardiman, Jacobs and Scott and referred to the Committee on Families and Human Services, places the collection of all past due money and accounts owed to the state or any subdivision, under the supervision and control of the Department of Treasury. This would seem to include any child support assigned to the state, and under the broadest construction might include any child support, alimony, or fees paid to the Friend of the Court.

The Family Law Section opposes this bill unless it clearly exempts support enforcement from the supervision and control of the Department of Treasury.
