Re: HB 5625 Representation in Small Claims Court

Dear Representative Mortimer:

At its June 9, 2006 meeting, the Board of Commissioners of the State Bar of Michigan unanimously voted to actively oppose HB 5625. The position was adopted after consideration of positions recommending opposition from the State Bar's Real Property Law Section, Committee on Justice Initiatives and Unauthorized Practice of Law Committee.

The Small Claims division of District Court specifically excludes non-attorney representation to maintain a system that is fair and equally accessible for all parties. The State Bar believes that the passage of HB 5625 would result in an imbalance within the small claims court as regular representation by increasingly sophisticated real estate agents would put inexperienced opposing parties at a disadvantage. Further, we are concerned that real estate agents assuming this responsibility would run the risk of the unauthorized practice of law.
