The Council of the Probate and Estate Planning Section recognizes that:

- Charitable organizations and foundations play an important role in the quality of life of Michigan.
- Michigan residents, families, businesses and foundations have shown historic generosity in supporting charitable causes as those causes evolve throughout the state, the nation and the world
- It is important to encourage charities and foundations to be established in and remain within Michigan.

- There is a need for laws and regulation that ensure charitable resources support the public good.

The Council of the Probate and Estate Planning Section resolves:

- To support legislation and regulation that encourage philanthropy and charitable giving.
- To support legislation and regulation that provide donors, charitable organizations and foundations the flexibility to respond to ever changing charitable needs and seize opportunities for the benefit of the public in Michigan, the nation and the world.
- To oppose legislation and regulation that determines donor intent or limits the flexibility granted by donors when making charitable gifts and in establishing, or during their involvement with, charitable organizations and foundations.

Therefore, the Council of the Probate and Estate Planning Section opposes HB 6153 and any other legislation that may unilaterally determine donor intent. The Council of the Probate and Estate Planning Section welcomes the opportunity to work with members of the Michigan legislature, policymakers, the Council of Michigan Foundations, the Council on Foundations and others in any efforts to encourage the continuation and growth of the generosity of the people of the State of Michigan.
