RECOMMEND STATE BAR ACTION ON THIS ISSUE:

Arguments for the position:

The committee is in agreement that we do not like the legislation but that comment on the content is not Keller permissible. Committee unanimously opposes (active opposition) the imposition of mandatory minimum sentences, which we believe is Keller permissible comment, because it effects the functioning of the Court by removing judicial discretion at sentencing.

Arguments against the position (if any):

None stated.

On November 17, 2006, the State Bar of Michigan's Board of Commissioners unanimously voted to actively oppose the provision in HB 6543 regarding mandatory sentencing based on historical positions.
