SB 62 (Gilbert) Property; conveyances; termination of tenancy by the entireties; allow in cases of spousal abandonment. Amends secs. 1 & 2 of 1927 PA 210 (MCL 557.101 & 557.102).

Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

The Section opposes SB 0062 for several reasons, including the following:

The bill would authorize a tenancy by the entireties to be terminated by means of a conveyance by only one of the tenants following a hearing and court order that the tenancy by the entireties by terminated, where the court, by a preponderance of the evidence, has determined that a spouse has been willfully absent from, deserted, or willfully neglected or refused to provide support for the other spouse. The Section objects to the listed reason for termination of a spouse's real estate interest;

There are many reasons justifying willful absence from a spouse;

Since the penalty here is so severe, the justifications for termination set forth in the bill should be described in greater detail;

Also, additional safeguards should be set forth in the hearing process.
