Re: **HB** 4267 Sliding Scale Attorney Fees

Dear Representative Caswell:

At its July 20, 2007 meeting, the State Bar of Michigan's Board of Commissioners unanimously voted to actively oppose<sup>1</sup> HB 4267. The position is based on a long-standing State Bar position that limiting contingency fees in turn limits the public's ability to retain counsel. This directly impacts the public's access to justice.

Consistent with its constitutional authority for supervision of the courts and regulation of the profession, the Michigan Supreme Court has addressed the issue of contingency fees in the Michigan Court Rules and the Michigan Rules of Professional Conduct. The State Bar believes that any changes concerning contingency fees are most appropriately addressed through changes to these rules.
