Oppose with recommended amendments

Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

The majority of the members voting opposed the bills, essentially because of disagreement with adopting a one-sided "loser pays" principle in this specific kind of case.

But the committee voted unanimously that if the bills are adopted (1) they should not mandate the imposition of attorney fees, but rather give the court discretion to award them, and (2) HB 4953 should refer to "actual reasonable attorney fees", as HB 5037 already does.
