Dear Senator Richardville:

At its April 2008 meeting, the State Bar of Michigan's Board of Commissioners unanimously voted to **oppose SB 1001 and SB 1002**.

Michigan judges already have the ability under both statute and court rule to award reasonable attorney fees and costs to a nonprevailing party. The State Bar is now engaged in efforts to evaluate the effectiveness of current sanction options. At the present time, there is no compelling evidence that the existing sanctions are not an adequate means of sanctioning those parties who bring forward frivolous claims. In the absence of that evidence, it is unwise to impose additional provisions sanctions that have the potential to thwart access to justice by discouraging the filing of meritorious claims.

In the considered judgment of the State Bar, it is important to maintain a judge's discretion to determine appropriate sanctions on a case by case basis, and to avoid a mandatory system that preclude judicial review of a specific case and circumstances.
