Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

SB 745 proposes to regionalize the election of Supreme Court justices. It would divide Michigan into seven equally populated Supreme Court districts (to be determined by the legislature) with each district to elect one justice. This would make each justice responsible to a narrow constituency, rather than looking out for the state as a whole. The Family Law Section believes it is especially important that our Supreme Court justices retain a statewide focus. We oppose this bill.
