## Introduction

The Annual Report is a key document required by the State Bar of Michigan as stated in its bylaws, cited below. An annual report assists future Section leaders in understanding the Section's history, and serves as a planning guideline for the upcoming year. Annual Reports are also the main source for those who are interested in joining to section to learn about the activities of the section and decide whether membership is of value to them. Each annual report is published on the Section's website, provided as a resource to the public and potential Section members, as well as to Bar staff. The annual reports are submitted to the Board of Commissioners at their July meeting. In addition to the required general summary of activities, many sections choose to include additional material in their reports.

#### Article VIII §1, Bylaws of the State Bar of Michigan

Every Section and State Bar entity so directed by the Board of Commissioners or Representative Assembly shall annually make a written report containing a summary of its activities during the association year which shall be submitted to the Secretary on or before May 31. Annual reports may not exceed five  $8 \ 1/2'' \times 11''$  pages unless a waiver of this limitation is approved by the Executive Director.

#### **Additional Materials**

Many sections provide more information in their annual reports than a general summary of activities. The second page of this document is a comprehensive list of other valuable materials that may or may not be included in an annual report, with additional guidelines for the section's consideration. This is not a list of required items for an annual report, simply a thorough list of information that is often of interest to the public, section members, the Commissioners, and Bar staff. If desired, the list may be used as a basic guideline for an annual report.

#### Templates

The final pages in this document are a simple template, which may be altered to the section's needs. The template attempts to break down the bylaw requirement of "summary of its activities" into a few generalized categories. It is not required that a section utilize the template.

**SECTION NAME:** Have there been any changes in the section name? Details provided may be interesting to the public and other readers.

**SECTION MISSION STATEMENT:** A Sections' mission statement is a critical description of the goals the Section sets for the whole of it's' membership. Including the statement in an Annual Report serves as a yardstick by which to measure progress.

OFFICERS AND COUNCIL MEMBERS: Including P#s accurately identifies officers and the council.

**SECTION COMMITTEES:** Descriptions of the various committees provides a clearer picture of a section's work, especially if the name of the chairperson and description of Committee activities are included. Including meeting schedules allows potential future volunteers for Committee work to better understand the frequency with which the committee meets.

**SECTION MEMBERSHIP:** Section membership fluctuates from year to year. Tracking the membership numbers at a set time of year, such as the Annual Report Deadline, can provide a good picture of changes in the Section membership.

**SECTION BYLAWS:** Awareness of Bylaws changes can be critical for understanding a Section's operation. Including the most recent revision date of the Bylaws will allow readers familiar with the Bylaws to ensure they have the most current version at hand. Additionally, if there are any forthcoming changes, this is a good opportunity to summarize plans briefly.

**SECTION PUBLICATIONS:** Some of the most frequent questions for Sections are in regard to publications the Section has produced. Providing a list including publication information for journals, newsletters and other publications creates a valuable resource.

**MEETINGS, ACTIVITIES, AND SEMINARS:** This is critical information for the Annual Report. Describing meetings, activities and seminars can be detailed, or brief. Suggestions for information to include are the date, location, and a minimum of one paragraph describing the event.

**SECTION LEGISLATURE AND POLICY:** The Section's involvement in legislature, policy, or *amicus curiae* is a matter of great interest, many questions are asked regarding the Sections involvement in such. A brief description of any such involvement is requested, as this falls under the heading of section activities.

**AWARDS:** Many Sections present awards, honors, or scholarships. The Annual Report is another opportunity to laud the recipients, as well as detail any awards presented to the Section itself. A description of the history of the award, or why the award is given, is useful.

**FINANCIAL REPORT:** Section finances vary from simple to complex. A brief statement of general budget information would be very appropriate to include in any Annual Report, or a reprinting of an annual Treasurer's report if the Section feel it is necessary.

**FUTURE GOALS AND ACTIVITIES:** Because the Annual Report is often used as a resource for future planning, and is viewed by members of the public who may be considering membership in the Section, a brief description of future goals and activities is recommended. This may also serve as a recommendation to the next Council.

**Committees:** The Section has four committees as summarized below.

Publication Committee: Sally Babbitt (P62120), Chair. The goal of the Publication Committee is to prepare articles for the Section's website and distribution to Section members by email. The Publication Committee is also looking into the feasibility of developing a blog as a forum for recent and relevant agricultural law information.

Program Committee: Matthew Johnson(P64772), Chair. The Program Committee is charged with planning roundtable programs throughout the state to develop interaction and information sharing among members of the section.

Food Law Committee: Sarah Harwood, Co-Chair. Kurt Brauer (P54061), Co-Chair. The Food Law Committee is charged with planning events and publications specifically focused on legal issues relating to food production and processing in Michigan.

Legislative Committee: Cindy Rhodes Victor (P33613), Chair. The Legislative Committee is charged with monitoring current legislative activity in Michigan as it relates to agricultural and food production. The Legislative Committee is developing a legislation tracker that will be posted on the Section's website.

**General Budget Information:** As of April 30, 2014, the Section's year-to-date gross revenue was \$3,975. The Section's year-to-date expenses as through April 30, 2014 were \$279.87. Significant items occurring in May that are not included in the April 30, 2014 year-to-date number involve income and expenses resulting from the Food Committee luncheon scheduled for June 3, 2014. The Section was fortunate and received generous sponsorship donations for the event from several Michigan law firms.

As mentioned elsewhere in this report, one goal of the Council and Committees is to hold periodic luncheons or other short programs throughout the state with the goal is providing relevant information to members and other attendees as well as providing the opportunity for interaction among agricultural and food law practitioners. The June 3, 2014 luncheon is one such event, with the topic of "Outbreaks in the Food Industry: What Really Happens During an Investigation" presented by Byron Beerbower, Compliance Manager at the Michigan Department of Agriculture & Rural Development.

The 1st Annual Program held in conjunction with the annual meeting was as success. Attendance was good and feedback was very favorable. The 2nd Annual Program planning is underway. Council consensus was the to provide another half-day program along with the annual meeting. The program will focus on two themes: (1) How the Farm Bill impacts Michigan Agriculture and (2) Farm-to-Table, a Legal Perspective. Speakers from government, the agricultural industry, and practitioners will speak on these topics and provide attendees with current, relevant information.

The Council decided to develop the first Student Agricultural and Food Law Symposium with the goal of increasing awareness of the importance of agricultural law in Michigan. The Symposium will be held at Michigan State University College of Law on November 7, 2014. Michigan law students and current law school graduates are invited to submit papers on agricultural and/or food law topics which will be evaluated by a panel of judges made up of Michigan agricultural and food law attorneys.

**Legislative issues:** The Section has a Legislative Committee to monitor current Michigan legislation as it relates to agriculture and food production and processing. The Legislative Committee is developing a legislation tracker that will be posted on the Section's website.

**Recommendations for next Council:** When the next Council starts its term, the Agricultural Law Section will have finished its first full year as a section. Since its inception, the Section's Council has worked to set the groundwork for the new Section, including forming the Program, Publication, Food Law and Legislative committees, holding a successful first Annual Program, creating a listserv and LinkedIn account for member discussion.

Specific current fiscal year activities include working to develop a strategic plan for the Section to assist future councils, working with the Publication Committee to develop articles on agricultural and food law issues, holding a luncheon specifically focused on inspections in the food industry, improving the Section's website by adding resources for agricultural and food law practitioners and

students interested in these areas, reaching out to law students interested in agricultural and food law and developing programs to increase student interaction.

The next Council should continue to plan short programs throughout the next year on agricultural and food law topics, with the goal of holding at least one luncheon type event quarterly. Assuming attendance at the Annual Program in favorable, the next Council should consider expanding the next Annual Program to a full day program so that the scope of the subject matter can be expanded. It is expected that the Student Agricultural Law Symposium will be a success and if so, the next Council should consider holding the Symposium again. The next Council should continue to consider the overall role of law school students advancing the practice of agricultural law in Michigan and should build on the student involvement that was gained in 2014. The next Council should work with the Publication Committee to develop a sustainable method of obtaining and delivering publications to section members, such as a blog or a quarterly newsletter. The next Council should evaluate the effectiveness of the listserv and should consider options to increase member use.

#### PUBLICATIONS

The Publications team of the ADR Section this year published *The ADR Quarterly* and made past editions freely available on its website: <u>http://www.michbar.org/adr/newsletter.cfm</u>. The ADR Quarterly was published in May and September 2013, and January and April 2014.

The ADR Announcement ListServ membership list was vetted and brought up to date in December 2013.Preliminary steps were taken for the ADR Section to sponsor the June 2015 ADR theme edition of the Michigan Bar Journal, and a call for authors for the Michigan Bar Journal theme edition has been issued. In addition, there have been consultations with the State Bar of Michigan concerning the transition of the Section's website to SBM Connect.

## DIVERSITY

Themes of this Task Force include:

- 1. Better understanding and considering cultures, languages and other factors among potential ADR end users so that more diverse end users may gain optimal access to and benefit from ADR.
- 2. Supporting individuals from diverse communities in becoming successful ADR providers so that the ADR provider pool will better reflect a wider spectrum of end users.
- 3. Increasing the cultural competence of all ADR providers so that the needs of all ADR end users may be better met.
- 4. Increasing community knowledge of, access to and receptivity to ADR, while ensuring that the ADR provided is tailored to the needs of all end users.

Activities this Bar year include:

- 1. Development of parameters for an ADR provider Mentoring program
- 2. Attended ABA Diversity seminar in March 2014 where information was gained about addressing issues affecting international cultures and women
- 3. Obtained information about the College of Commercial Arbitrators, an invitation only group actively seeking to increase its diversity.
- 4. Participated in a National ACR sponsored Diversity seminar featuring Marvin Johnson and Lou Giesel speaking on the need for more diverse ADR providers
- 5. Planning with ACR of Southeast Michigan a 2 to 4 hour diversity seminar for later this year
- 6. Meeting with minority arbitrators involved in pursuing greater opportunities in the ADR field in Michigan

#### NOMINATING

At the ADR Section Annual Meeting on September 28, 2013, William Weber was presented with the Section's Distinguished Service Award to honor his significant contributions in the

field of dispute resolution. Also at that time the Nanci S. Klein award was bestowed upon Pamela Chapman Enslen for her valuable work in community dispute resolution.

#### SKILLS

The Skills Action Team has hosted three events during the last year.

First, the 2013 Annual Meeting was held at the Radisson Kingsley Inn in Bloomfield Hills September 27 and 28, 2013. We departed from our standard format of bringing in a national speaker to showcase the talents of local ADR providers, which proved to be very popular. The 2014 Annual Meeting will take place at Ann Arbor's Kensington Court where we will resume our national speaker format with mediator and mediation trainer Cheryl Cutrona.

On March 13, 2014, we held the 13th Annual Advanced Negotiation & Dispute Resolution Institute at the Inn at St. John's in Plymouth, co-sponsored by the State Court Administrative Office and the Institute of Continuing Legal Education (ICLE). Our national speaker was the popular Andy LIttle, author of "Making Money Talk". The Institute was a critical success although attendance was down.

The Section offered a telephone seminar on the new business court featuring Dick Hurford, Jerry Rock and Judge John Foster, Chief Judge Macomb County Circuit Court. Bob Wright hosted the seminar that attracted 40 registrants. The section is also planning a telephone seminar for the fall featuring Laura Athens on understanding the dynamics of bullying in school and how to mediate disputes arising out of bullying situations.

#### JUDICIAL ACCESS TEAM

The Judicial Access Team ("JAT") meets by phone on the third Thursday of the month at 4:00 PM. We met on 2/20, 4/17, and 5/15/14. Our team has developed four subcommittees to address: 1) creation of a roster of ADR neutrals, 2) education of judges on ADR, 3) education of attorneys on ADR and 4) creation of a clearinghouse of ADR procedures.

The JAT's objectives are to communicate with lawyers and judges regarding ADR, including early disposition of cases, to create a roster of neutrals who are qualified by training and experience to assist courts with ADR, and to help the SBM ADR Section become a clearing house for various ADR procedures, and how courts can utilize them. This includes supporting and helping in the development of the new Business Courts, that present an excellent opportunity to serve as an example of how early ADR can lead to successful outcomes for business and other cases.

#### GOVERNMENTAL TASK FORCE

Over the past year, the Governmental Task Force has worked with several governmental agencies. This work includes interacting with the City of Inkster to help it develop ways to address its economic and community revitalization and with some City of Ann Arbor elected officials to facilitate town meetings regarding public transit issues. It has likewise met with state officials such as the MDNR to discuss trail user disputes, LARA regarding wage/hour

disputes and a state representative from the Lansing area who is a trained mediator and willing to introduce legislation to assure that state administrators have legislative ability to utilize mediation. The Task Force has also developed relationships with the State Attorney General's office and with other legislators. Some specific areas to which they plan to turn in the future are in developing a relationship with the Michigan Municipal League and MEDC.

#### **EFFECTIVE PRACTICES AND PROCEDURES**

The Effective Practices and Procedures Action Team ("EPP") is involved in reviewing legislative, policy, and/or amicus curiae activities involving alternative dispute resolution. Pursuant to that involvement, the EPP Committee this past year assisted in obtaining amendments to MCR 3.602 to conform to the requirements of the Revised Uniform Arbitration Act. The top three goals for 2013 and 2014, besides obtaining the court rule amendment, included the development of an arbitrator's basic training course to be offered in Michigan. To that end, EPP has been working with the American Arbitration Association to develop the curriculum for this program and trainers have been selected. It is anticipated that this course will be launched during 2014-2015. Another of EPP's goals was to examine the possibility of mandatory ADR in all Michigan courts. Pursuant to that end, a special task force has been organized to work with EPP in examining, developing and if appropriate, proposing legislation and/or court rules to make ADR mandatory. A strategic plan on accomplishing this goal is in the process of being put together.

EPP has also reviewed and supported the adoption of the Uniform Collaborative Law Act that is currently winding its way through the legislature and has been passed by the state senate. The Committee also reviewed and is supporting the development of procedures to allow a joint petition for filing for divorce (i.e., taking the "vs." out of a divorce). Pursuant to same, a special task force has been developed to look at amending Michigan Court Rule 2.201 to change the designations requirement of a plaintiff and a defendant. EPP telephone conference meetings are held on the first Tuesday of each month at 4:30 p.m.

#### **Recommendations for the next Council:**

- A. Follow-up on priorities developed in 2013's retreat/planning session
- B. Continue webinars and telephonic seminars to train ADR professionals and others
- C. Research what other jurisdictions are doing to promote greater use of ADR
- D. Sponsor more events geared toward educating advocates in ADR
- E. Develop a private ADR provider/neutral directory
- F. Pursue additional opportunities to increase the use of ADR by governmental agencies
- G. Create mentorships between new (and/or student) and experienced ADR professionals to increase diversity in the field and to increase membership
- H. Support Public Service Announcements and other methods of informing the public about the uses and benefits of ADR.

## **Commercial Litigation Committee**

The Commercial Litigation Committee assists litigators as well as business and corporate counsel in addressing issues that may lead to or arise in business-related litigation. The Committee sponsors seminars and other programs that address such issues and that are designed to enhance the practice of those involved in commercial litigation.

## **Corporate Laws Committee**

The Corporate Laws Committee monitors and reviews matters relating to corporate law statutes and developments in the law of corporate governance. The committee also works with the Business Corporation Act Revision Subcommittee, which reviews the Michigan Business Corporation Act for the purpose of keeping it current with developments in corporate law and which assists from time to time in drafting and advocating proposed changes to the Act.

#### Debtor/Creditor Rights Committee

The Debtor/Creditor Rights Committee focuses on issues of insolvency, such as bankruptcy, state law alternatives to bankruptcy, secured lending (Article 9 of the Uniform Commercial Code), and state law exemptions.

## **Financial Institutions Committee**

The Financial Institutions Committee focuses on legislative, regulatory and judicial developments and issues of interest to financial institutions (primarily banks) and their affiliates.

#### **In-House Counsel Committee**

The In-House Counsel Committee is committed to addressing the professional interests of in-house counsel by sponsoring continuing legal education programs, informing members about issues of particular interest to them, and offering social and professional networking opportunities.

#### Law Schools Committee

The Law Schools Committee is designed to promote an interest in business law among students at each of the law schools located in Michigan. The Committee represents a collaborative effort between the Section and the business law societies at the University of Michigan Law School, Michigan State University College of Law, University of Detroit Mercy School of Law, Wayne State University Law School and Thomas M. Cooley Law School. The Committee supports programs initiated by the business law societies within the law schools and provides a forum for networking among law students and members of the Section.

#### Nonprofit Corporations Committee

The Nonprofit Corporations Committee's principal responsibility is to review and update laws relating to the organization of nonprofit corporations in Michigan. The principal focus has been on the Nonprofit Corporation Act, but it also reviews other legislation, such as bills regulating the solicitation of contributions by charities. The committee also assists with sponsoring continuing legal education programs directed at nonprofit organization issues.

#### **Regulation of Securities Committee**

The Regulation of Securities Committee is concerned with federal and state laws and regulations relating to the offer, sale and trading of securities. The Committee also supplies a liaison to the Securities Law Advisory Committee of the Michigan Corporations, Securities and Commercial Licensing Bureau. Activities are designed to inform members of current developments and issues and provide input to appropriate administrative and legislative bodies.

#### **Uniform Commercial Code Committee**

The Uniform Commercial Code Committee monitors developments and issues under all Articles of the UCC and related commercial statutes. In October of each year, the Committee presents a seminar on recent developments in commercial law. Additionally, the Committee prepares an annual survey of case law involving the UCC and commercial law.

#### **Unincorporated Enterprises Committee**

The Committee remains active in conducting seminars regarding unincorporated enterprises, focusing principally on limited liability companies. The Committee has also assisted in informing members of the bar from other sections as to legislation affecting unincorporated enterprises. Membership in the Committee is open to all members of the Business Law Section. The focus of the Committee's activities has been to present seminars in conjunction with ICLE and the Business Law Section. Membership and the opportunity to play a significant role in the Committee's activities is and will continue to be open to all members of this Section. As with most other committees, the

Unincorporated Enterprises Committee schedules meetings primarily in the Western region of the Detroit metropolitan area. It is hoped that continued efforts to attract interest to the Committee will be successful.

# SECTION LEGISLATURE AND POLICY:

The Michigan Supreme Court requested that the Business Law Section submit an amicus brief to address the issues raised by the case of *Madugula v. Taub*. The Section established a process to timely respond. Three issues were raised in the appeal; the Section addressed all three. The positions of the Section in the amicus brief are: (1) claims brought under MCL 450.1489 are equitable claims to be decided by a court of equity; (2) the provisions of a stockholders' agreement can create shareholder interests protected by MCL 450.1489 provided such interests are interests typically associated with being a shareholder and the interference substantially interferes with the total mix of the shareholder's rights; and (3) retention of one's status as a shareholder and director does not preclude a Section 489 action. In the case of *Madugula v. Taub*, the Section asserted that the trial court should have made the determination of whether there was oppression under all of the circumstances, and if oppression were found, devise an appropriate remedy. These errors were upheld by the court of appeals. The Section requested that even though the lower courts failed to properly apply the law in question, the Supreme Court should render a decision consistent with the above positions.

The Section was asked by the Government Relations Office of the State Bar of Michigan to comment on the proposed amendment of Rule 2.112 of the Michigan Court Rules concerning business court litigation practice. The Section has been active in advocating for implementation of business courts. After review, the Section supported the amendment 10-0-0 with additional suggested comments. The position was adopted after discussion and vote at a special meeting on December 2, 2013 with 12 voting for, 0 voting against, 0 abstaining, and 3 did not vote.

The Nonprofit Corporation Committee has reviewed the proposed amendments to the Nonprofit Corporation Act and the amendments to the related statutes. The Section supports the proposed amendments and related states. The Section has engaged Karoub Associates to assist with the amendments for a one year contract in 2014 to have a bill introduced as soon as possible in the

2013-2014 legislative session that would implement the BLS requested legislative changes regarding amendments to Michigan's Nonprofit Corporation Act.

## Stephen H. Schulman Outstanding Business Lawyer Award

The Section established the Stephen H. Schulman Outstanding Business Lawyer Award in 2006, to be presented annually. The award honors Michigan business lawyers who consistently exemplify the characteristics the Business Law Section seeks to foster and facilitate: the highest quality of professionalism, the highest quality of practice, an unwavering dedication to service, ethical conduct, and collegiality within the practice of law. The Section honored Daniel H. Minkus at its Annual Meeting on September 26, 2013, at the Sheraton Detroit Novi. # **INTRODUCTION**

The Children's Law Section is very active and spent this year updating its existing committee structure. The focus of the renovation was the revision and replacement of outdated practices, policies and procedures. The Children's Law Section has big plans for the future. It has started working on these plans by establishing several new subcommittees; seeking out opportunities for membership growth; and developing tools that will assist legal professionals and the public in the specialized areas of juvenile law.

# **MISSION STATEMENT**

The Children's Law Section revised its Mission Statement this year. The mission of the Children's Law Section is to serve and protect the interests of children, families, and legal professionals that are involved in juvenile justice, child welfare proceedings, adoption, and other related areas of legal practice affecting the rights of parents and children. The mission is two-fold in that 1) the Children's Law Section serves and protects the interests of children and families in legal proceedings by initiating and monitoring legislation; adopting positions on issues of public concern; writing and submitting amicus briefs to the Michigan Supreme Court; providing public service programs, trainings and outreach; and initiating, participating, and monitoring agency actions, policies and developments; and 2) The Children's Law Section functions to promote and protect the interests of attorneys and legal professionals that represent children and families by offering education, training, resources and tools to competently represent clients; offering mentoring and networking opportunities for legal professionals; adopting positions on legal issues of importance to attorneys that practice juvenile law; and initiating and monitoring court rule changes to effectuate proper and practical implementation of legal mandates.

# SECTION STANDING COMMITTEES

# AMICUS COMMITTEE

The Amicus Committee is responsible for responding to invitations from the Michigan Supreme Court for preparation of amicus curiae briefs related to issues concerning the mission of the Children's Law Section. The Amicus Committee is accountable for reviewing and monitoring pending Michigan Supreme Court, Michigan Court of Appeals and local county cases for possible intervention in matters affecting the practice of juvenile law and public policy concerns. The Amicus Committee reviews requests from individuals and organizations for potential support and/or opposition in cases that have systemic impact and/or cases of global importance. The Amicus Committee researches, drafts and files the necessary legal documents on behalf of the Children's Law Section. This year, the Amicus Committee drafted and submitted two briefs on behalf of the Children's Law Section. The first brief, written by Elizabeth Warner, focused on the One-Parent Doctrine in the case of *In re Sanders, SC 146680.* The second brief, written by Tobin Miller, tackled the issue of juvenile guardianships in the case of *In re COH, ERH, JRG, KBH, SC147515.* 

# LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

The Legislative Committee conducts analysis of pending legislation and identifies, prioritizes, and organizes legislation that should be considered for action by the Children's Law Section. The members of the Legislative Committee are actively engaged in drafting bills, attending legislative meetings and hearings, and lobbying for positions taken by the Children's Law Section. The Children's Law Section employs the support of a lobbyist, William Kandler of Kandler, Cusmano & Reed, whom handles the coordination of the committee's legislative events. Under the leadership of Jack McKaig, the Legislative Committee has focused on developing relationships and legislation with the University of Michigan Legislative Clinic led by Donald Duquette on topics such as parental rights reinstatement, sibling visitation, legal representation for child welfare agencies, human trafficking, and due process for non-respondent parents. Further, the committee has independently pursued and monitored legislation concerning best interest factors, adoption matters, juvenile lifer sentencing, performance-based funding, recording of child interviews, foster parents bill of rights, and a host of other legislative topics that were raised throughout the year.

# EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Education Committee is charged with the task of developing and implementing educational programs, trainings, brochures and informational materials, and conferences for legal professionals and the public concerning juvenile subjects. The Education Committee is working to meet membership demands. A survey was sent out to all members requesting input regarding training topics, speakers, and locations for Children's Law Section events. The response yielded excellent results that will be used to plan for the future. The Education Committee is busy working on the Annual Conference and is incorporating what it has learned from the membership

survey. In addition to the Annual Conference, the Education Committee is developing flyers and brochures which describe the goals and objectives of the Children's Law Section and its programs. Megan Mertens designed a handout template that will be used for the creation and distribution of informational materials to prospective members and others wishing to obtain more information about the Children's Law Section. Debra McNabb is in charge of identifying Section promotional items. In the upcoming year, the Education Committee will be creating local training opportunities for attorneys and developing corresponding materials to enhance the quality of legal representation. The Lawyer-Guardian Ad Litem Protocol and the Parent Attorney Protocol are currently being reviewed by the Children's Law Section Council for updates and possible changes in efforts underway to enhance the quality of legal representation.

# **BY-LAW COMMITTEE**

The By-Law Committee monitors the by-laws of the Children's Law Section and ascertains and drafts provisions for inclusion and/or exclusion that affect the functioning of the section. This year, the By-Law Committee is working on improving the by-laws in the area of electronic voting. The Children's Law Section Council and the Legislative Committee have discovered the need for additional provisions related to electronic voting in order to expedite actions of the Council in matters that are time-sensitive. The By-Law Committee is also considering changes to the by-laws which will adopt process and procedures for the handling of legislation by the Legislative Committee.

# COMMITTEES DEVELOPED THIS YEAR

# PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE

The Publications Committee is responsible for producing the Michigan Child Welfare Journal. The Child Welfare Journal is a quarterly publication edited by Joseph Kozakiewicz from the Michigan State University Chance at Childhood Program. The Publications Committee drafts articles, recruits writers for journal entries, edits articles, reviews submissions, and ensures the dissemination and distribution of each edition. Karen Cook heads the Children's Law Section Publication Committee and is responsible for gathering subject matter for the journal. The journal has a new cover that has changed the entire look of the publication to go along with its new content. The journal now focuses on substantive articles geared toward juvenile legal practice. The journal has recently added unique routine columns. William Kandler provides a regular summary entitled "Legislative Update". A similar "Caselaw Update" keeps attorneys informed of the latest case developments around the state. The journal has added "Attorneys Making a Difference" written by Stephanie Cardenas. Stephanie's article focuses on attorneys that are changing the practice of juvenile law and/or are making a significant contribution to their communities. The Children's Law Section would like attorneys that practice juvenile law work to be recognized for their impactful actions and heroic efforts, both in and out of the courtroom. The journal will now devotes a portion of the journal to "Upcoming Events and Activities" to keep our membership informed of the latest trainings, conferences, and events. As part of the new and improved journal, consideration for the future is being given to securing advertising to support the continued distribution of the Child Welfare Journal to members. The journal is offered on-line and can be viewed on a desk-top computer, tablet or cell phone.

# AGENCY COMMITTEE

The Agency Committee is responsible for reviewing policies, procedures and practices of agencies and professionals that handle juvenile law matters. The Agency Committee identifies, analyzes, recommends, and implements actions on behalf of the Children's Law Section to protect the interests of children, families and legal professionals affected by systemic practices in the area of juvenile law. Joe Kozely has provided the Council with valuable suggestions and ideas related to this committee. The Agency Committee is currently reviewing and monitoring performance-based models of practice and evidence-based research employed by various private and governmental agencies.

# MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

The Membership Committee serves to recruit new members and to maintain existing members of the Children's Law Section. This year, the Membership Committee led by Suzanne Stephan, enhanced membership by recruiting young lawyers and law students. Alicia Fabiano was instrumental in personally securing the presence of law students at several Children's Law Section Council meetings this past year. Other members have also invited potential members to join in various meetings and events. The Membership Committee has sought out law school staff for the purpose of hosting recruitment tables and for providing informational and legal presentations concerning juvenile law future lawyers. A banner was purchased to publicize Children's Law Section events and to raise Section visibility. Contact has been made with various other organizations and agencies that sponsor legal trainings for attorneys. Requests have been made to these groups for Children's Law Section inclusion in advertising and involvement. The Children's Law Section sponsored a vendor table at the Young Lawyer's Summit where many attorneys expressed interest in juvenile law work. The Membership Committee is close to rolling out a Mentor-Mentee program for attorneys that wish to practice in the areas of juvenile law. Attorneys can be paired with and learn from an experienced juvenile law attorney in their local county. Seasoned attorneys can volunteer for mentorship services to share their knowledge and improve the practice of juvenile law for their colleagues.

# SOCIAL COMMITTEE

The Social Committee plans and arranges social events for Children's Law Section members. Erin House provides leadership for the Social Committee. The Social Committee has hosted its first holiday party for members this year. This Social Committee works closely with the Membership Committee to promote the Children's Law Section. In the upcoming months, the Social Committee will focus its efforts on coordinating additional membership events geared towards networking and social interactions for Children's Law Section members.

# COURT RULES COMMITTEE

The Court Rules Committee monitors proposed court rule changes, administrative orders, and existing court rules for the Children's Law Section. Robbie Powelson has been appointed as the person responsible for this committee. The Court Rules Committee prepares analysis and drafts proposed rules and amendments. It brings information concerning court rule support, opposition, and changes to the attention of the Children's Law Section, State Bar of Michigan Representative Assembly and others to facilitate the improvement and/or enhancement of juvenile legal proceedings. This year, the Court Rules Committee reviewed court rules pertaining to the Consent Calendar, adoption rules, juvenile guardianship rules, among other proposed rules.

# NEW INITIATIVES COMMITTEE

The New Initiatives Committee identifies innovative ways to handle and implement juvenile law issues. This committee is responsible for proposing ideas to the Children's Law Section for consideration. John Cici has been appointed as this committee's leader. As the Children's Law Section moves forward, this committee will take on a greater role within the organization.

# **SECTION AWARDS**

**Legislative issues:** Members of the council were actively engaged in giving testimony on behalf of consumers' rights at legislative hearings regarding changes to the Michigan Foreclosure Statutes this year.

**Recommendations for next Council:** Plans have been initiated and are underway to organize and present seminars focused toward both attorneys and the general public. The seminar program currently under consideration that is focused toward attorneys would be a trial practice type of seminar using a consumer issue as the background case. **Legislative issues:** 2013-14 was a productive but frustrating year for the CLS Council. In this era of 'fast track' legislation, and partisan politics, the era of deliberative legislation seemingly has become the exception rather than the rule. In 2013-14 the CLS Council weighed in on proposed Juvenile Life Sentencing; Expunction; Sobriety Courts; Preliminary Examination legislation; Driver Responsibility Fees; Court of Claims re-organizations; Mileage for Jurors; Recording of child testimony; Saliva-based roadside drug testing; Sexual Assault kits; and a proposed amendment to MCR 6.302; . At the direction of the Council, letters were also sent on matters of interest to the Section: Saliva-based roadside testing, the use of COMPAS in pre-sentence reports, the reporting of expenditures under the Michigan Campaign Finance Act, Appointment of a CLS member to the Indigent Defense Commission, and to the MSC Task Force on the role of the State Bar.

**Recommendations for next Council:** The CLS Council may need to explore new alternatives. In person seminars are being replaced by video conferencing and information readily available via online research and listservs. Term limits, fast track legislation, and partisan politics suggest that the prior deliberative process utilized by the Section and State Bar may no longer be an effective means of advocacy. The Council may thereby need to explore old and new alternative means to collaborate with the legislative and administrative bodies of government, and partnerships with other sections and/or entities to provide educational opportunities/resources to its members.

**Other Information:** With over 2,000 members, the CLS includes academia, prosecutors, criminal defense attorneys, judges, and representatives from the Michigan Judges Association, Michigan District Judges Association, Prosecuting Attorneys Association of Michigan, the Criminal Defense Attorneys of Michigan, Children's Law Section, Criminal Issues Initiative and the Prisons and Corrections Section of the State Bar. At the SBM Annual Meeting in September, 2013, the Criminal Law Section, with the Prisons & Corrections Section and the EAI Disabilities Workgroup, presented a panel discussion relating to problem-solving courts and pilot projects across the state: Lessons Learned & Implications for People with Mental Health Care Needs. In October of 2013 the Lt. Governor was our guest speaker at the CLS orientation brunch to start the section year. At our Winter and Spring Conference, presentations were made on Eyewitness Identification and Forensic Science. In 2013-14 the Section offered Traveling Roadshows on topics of interest, with presentation and panel discussions involving academia, judges, prosecutors and defense counsel. Council members met with representatives formulating preliminary examination legislation reform, continued to collaborate with other sections on topics of similar interest, and are engaged to meet with representatives of the Council for State Governments for the Sentencing Commission reforms. During the 2013-14, the CLS Council formulated a policy for the filing of Amicus Curiae briefs. In 2013-14 the CLS Council utilized a voting process by email to address legislative issues and other matters of concern to the section requiring immediate action. The CLS Council also supported financially the Young Lawyers Section Annual Summit in May of 2014, helped fund a grant to a Section member for a research project relating to collateral consequences, and added a representative from the Michigan District Judges Association to the Council.

Also, continuing the ongoing efforts to secure more stable committee leadership and to develop more committee/section member interaction and continuing to increase value for section members, with a focus on effective transitioning from committee membership to effective leadership, should remain in the forefront to assure continued growth for the Section and its membership.

**OTHER INFORMATION:** The Section is on a sound financial footing despite a net loss of membership during the economic downturn. Several multi-year initiatives continue to show progress, including significant headway toward completion of a second edition of its online Deskbook and the transition of the Deskbook to systems preferred by the State Bar of Michigan.

The Air Committee meets several times a year to discuss emerging air-related topics, organize air-related programs, and conduct other types of outreach to Environmental Law Section members, including sponsoring site visits.

The Air Committee welcomes any Environmental Law Section member interested in air issues to participate in upcoming activities, which are typically publicized though the Environmental Law Section e-mail distribution list, calendar, and social media outlets.

**THE DESKBOOK COMMITTEE** is responsible for completion of a second edition of "Michigan Environmental Law Deskbook, 2nd Edition," an online publication which is in the process of revision and transition to systems preferred by the State Bar of Michigan.

**THE ENVIRONMENTAL LITIGATION AND ADMINISTRATIVE PRACTICE COMMITTEE** is responsible for legal issues that relate to environmental disputes in administrative, state, and federal jurisdictional forums. The committee periodically arranges programs on these topics. The environmental litigation committee welcomes any Section member interested in the foregoing issues and maintains an e-mail list to notify members of meetings and events.

**THE GREAT LAKES AND INLAND WATERS COMMITTEE** closely follows environmental developments regarding the Great Lakes and tracks developments in federal, state, and local regulation of discharges to and use of surface water and groundwater. The Committee periodically arranges programs in which experts in these areas discuss important developments. These programs also offer an opportunity for Section members to meet and benefit from learning about other attorneys' experiences in working on water-related matters. The Great Lakes and Inland Waters Committee welcomes any Environmental Law Section member interested in the foregoing issues and maintains an e-mail list to notify members of meetings and events.

**THE HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES AND BROWNFIELDS COMMITTEE** is responsible for legal issues that relate to the treatment, storage, disposal, and remediation of hazardous substances (including hazardous wastes) under both federal and state law, including CERCLA, RCRA subtitle C, and Parts 111 and 201 of NREPA. It is also responsible for the topics of liability under those statutes for injunctive relief, recovery of response costs and natural resource damages, related contribution actions, and associated claims for insurance coverage. Finally, it is responsible for the topic of managing transactions that are complicated by the real or potential presence of hazardous substances by environmental investigations, baseline environmental assessments and related mechanisms, environmental insurance, and incentives for brownfield re-development.

The Hazardous Substances Committee welcomes any Environmental Law Section member interested in the foregoing issues and maintains an e-mail list to notify members of meetings and events.

**MICHIGAN ENVIRONMENTAL LAW JOURNAL/PUBLICATIONS:** The Journal Committee publishes a quarterly electronic newsletter that includes scholarly articles about environmental issues, as well as information about section activities and events, important decisions by Michigan and federal courts in environmental cases, and new Michigan environmental regulations and legislation. The committee increases the level of interest in environmental law by sponsoring an annual writing competition among law students at all Canadian and U.S law schools. Winners of the writing competition receive generous cash awards and have their articles published in the section's Michigan Environmental Law Journal.

**THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE** mission is to: (1) assist the Section and each of the other committees in their respective functions by providing useful information about the membership of the section and its needs and interests; (2) increase Section membership; and (3) promote race/ethnic and gender diversity in the membership and leadership of the section. The Membership Committee encourages any interested Environmental Law Section members to join this committee or attend the next meeting.

**THE NATURAL RESOURCES COMMITTEE** tracks developments in federal state and local laws and regulations that relate to issues concerning natural resources, including wetlands, oil and gas, mining, forestry, and fisheries. The Committee periodically arranges programs on these topics.

**THE PROGRAM COMMITTEE** plans educational programs for the benefit of Section members. The Committee meets monthly by phone for about an hour to discuss the needs and interests of the members. The programs are designed to provide members with information on important new developments and opportunities for socializing and networking with other Section members. The length and content of programs vary widely, from informal lunch roundtables covering one topic to multiple day seminars that cover numerous topics. The committee selects dates, locations, and general themes for the programs, and one or two committee members will chair or co-chair the programs. The chair/co-chairs arrange for speakers and other details of the programs. Certain program committee members also function as liaisons to the subject matter committees to facilitate programming for those committees. This year the Committee has increased the Section's utilization of webinars as one of its programming methods.

In short, the Program Committee provides opportunities for members to be kept informed on important new developments in the environmental legal landscape. Planning those opportunities is an effective and fun way to participate in Section activities. The Program Committee welcomes any Environmental Law Section member interested in keeping Section members up to date on current events and maintains an e-mail list to notify members of meetings and events.

**THE TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE** supports the Section's use of Bar-provided resources such as the list serve and the website, and investigates, develops and supports the use of newer communications technologies as suggested by the Section. The Technology Committee also investigates and prepares presentations for the Section on new environmental technologies. The Technology Committee welcomes any Environmental Law Section member interested in the section's technology related issues, and maintains an e-mail list to notify members of meetings and events.

**THE ENERGY AND SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE** is scheduling a meeting/telephone conference to brainstorm/select topics/speakers for a series of mid-day brown bag webinars utilizing the Section's interactive webinar service. A program is being tentatively being planned in July. Possible partnering with one or more other subject matter committees to have a combined program will also be discussed. Current webinar planning and possible topics include: Review of the four energy initiative reports (Renewable Energy, Energy Efficiency, Electric Choice and Additional Areas) from MPSC and the Michigan Energy Office which were the subject of seven public forums held around the state in 2013 following Governor Snyder's 2013 address on Energy and the Environment, entitled:

"Readying Michigan to Make Good Energy Decisions." The reports were released for public comment during 4th Q 2013; Sustainability and the new Federal vision; Climate, Energy, and Economic Security integration; Solar Leases, Biodigestor energy production and incentives; LEED Developments: US Green Building Council Green Screen Credits; Recycling Initiatives; Water/Energy Climate Change Overview; Public Trust Doctrine and Water Use; Climate Change Impacts on the Insurance Industry; Michigan's Response to Climate Change through MPSC Initiatives; PACE Legislation; Sustainable Entrepreneurship in Michigan, and other topics to be discussed during brainstorming sessions.

**SECTION MEMBERSHIP:** Section membership fluctuates from year to year. Tracking the membership numbers at a set time of year, such as the Annual Report deadline, can provide a good picture of changes in the section membership.

#### General Budget Information:

The Family Law Section commenced FY 2013-2014 in September, 2013, with a budget surplus of approximately \$20,000.00. This represented a significant decrease from a surplus of over \$100,000.00 over the last couple of years. This decrease has been countered by the transition to an Electronic Journal, and other significant cost cutting measures. The Section anticipates a significant increase in the end of year, September fund balance.

#### Events and/or Seminars:

The Family Law Section actively partners with the Institute of Continuing Legal Education, Ann Arbor, MI, and furnishes speakers and written materials for all of the ICLE Family Seminars during the year. In addition, the Family Law Section is a co-sponsor of the Family Law Institute and furnishes nearly all speakers and written materials for the annual Family Law Institute held in November each year. This 1 ½ day Seminar is the premier Family Law event in Michigan. The Institute had a new location at the Suburban Collection Exhibition Center in Novi, Michigan. There were a record number of attendees, Attorneys, Judges, and Friend of the Court staff present. In conjunction with the ICLE, the Section was most proud to have long time Section Member Diana Raimi be the recipient of the *Blaine Johnson Award* which recognizes outstanding contributions to continuing legal education in Michigan. In addition there are approximately 6 to 8 ICLE Family Law seminars each year, as well as the ICLE Certificate Program, with presenters from the Family Law Section.

#### Legislative issues:

The Legislative Committee of the Family Law Council includes Members Kent Weichmann as Chair, Daniel Bates, Carol Breitmeyer, Hon. Richard Halloran, Christopher Harrington, Sahera Housey, Rebecca Shiemke, Ross Stancati, Robert Treat, Randall Velzen and Tina Yost Johnson, as well as non-Council Members Barbara Kelly as Co-Chair, Sandy Glazier, Lauran Howard and William Kandler. Every single legislative proposal involving Family Law is reviewed by this Committee, recommendations submitted to Council, and positions on the legislation published on the State Bar website. This is a key committee, and its input is critical to protection of families and children in Michigan.

The Legislative Committee reviewed 62 family law bills, and made recommendations to Council on each bill. The Legislative Committee also obtained sponsors for the Uniform Collaborative Law Act, the Uniform Child Abduction Prevention Act, the Parenting Coordination Act, and a package of bills to streamline Adoption. The Legislative Committee is working to affect bills to revise the Paternity Establishment Process, as well as promote sponsored bills.

#### Court Rules & Ethics Committee:

The Court Rules & Ethics Committee includes the Chair, Mathew Kobliska, and members Carol Breitmeyer, Elizabeth Bransdorfer, Sahera Housey, Steven Reinheimer, Kristen Robinson, Rebecca Shiemke, Kent Weichmann, and Tina Yost Johnson. Non-Council members include Lori Buiteweg, Jennifer Johnson, Andrew Littman, Elizabeth Sadowski, and Amy Spilman.

This is also a key committee. Every proposed Court Rule, or Court rule Amendment involving Family Law is considered by this Committee.

The Committee has taken a variety of positions on proposed Court Rules, including "support" or "support with conditions"; it has also opposed numerous court rules amendments which would adversely affect family law. The Committee responded to the request of the Michigan Supreme Court for the section's position in In re: Timothy T. Fryhoff. There are a number of proposed Court rules amendments which originated with the Committee, including MCR 7.204 (docketing statement); MCR 2.107 and 2.117 (duration of appearances – enacted); MCR 2.302 (post-Judgment discovery); MCR 3.211 (post-Judgment arbitration of limited matters). These proposals are at various stages of the amendment process. The Committee has also worked with SCAO Forms Committee regarding changes in MC 306 (substitution of attorneys).

The Committee's proposed amendment to MCR 2.302 has received wide support from family law practitioners and judges. The proposal was recently the subject of Public Hearing before the Michigan Supreme Court on May 28, 2014 and the subject of testimony by Court Rules Chair Matt Kobliska. The Supreme Court also considered ADM 2010-32 which would establish a separate "Default Judgment" and "Consent Judgment" Court Rule for family law cases. The Family Law Section Chair, James J. Harrington III testified in favor of this court rule before the Supreme Court.

The Committee and the Family Law Section have also been constructive participants in the development of e-filing rules and processes.

#### Amicus Committee:

The Amicus Committee is Chaired by former Council member Anne Argiroff, and Co-Chaired by Member Rebecca Shiemke. The Committee includes Members Elizabeth Bransdorfer, Kristen Robinson, Gail Towne and Kent Weichmann. Non-Council members include Judith Curtis, Trish Haas, Katherine Root, Joanne Ross, Erica Salerno, and Liisa Speaker.

The Amicus Committee has received and reviewed numerous amicus requests involving Family Law. It has filed various Amicus briefs, including *In re: AJR*, *Furneauz v Miller*, *In re: Mays, In re: Sanders/Laird*. The Committee has also summarized appellate case decisions for each issue of Family Law Journal.

#### Alternative Dispute Resolution:

The Alternative Dispute Resolution Committee is chaired by Council Member Randall Velzen, and includes Member Gail Towne, as well as Non-Council Members Deb Berecz, Nina Abrams, Shelley Kester and Zena Zumeta. The ADR Committee has continued its efforts to reach out across the State with approximately 8 small meetings to facilitate understanding and use of ADR and evaluate improvements for delivery of ADR information to the Family Law Section.

#### Domestic Violence:

The Domestic Violence Committee is Chaired by Council Member Rebecca Shiemke. Members Daniel Bates, Hon. Richard Halloran, Kent Weichmann were joined by Non-Council Members Kari

Deming and Antoinette Raheem. This Committee reviewed and commented on a package of approximately ten Domestic Violence bills, in conjunction with a work group established by Representative Santana's office.

**Family Law Journal:** The newly appointed Editor of the Family Law Journal, Anthea Papista, and her co-editors have performed an incredible transition from a bulky, unwieldy, and expensive paper Journal to a fully electronic Family Law Journal. This new format has reduced expenses of the Journal an estimated 66 2/3 % while at the same time offering significantly expanded publishing capability, hyperlinks for advertisers and contributors. In addition, the first rollout edition of the Family Law Journal was a "special edition" and co-Edited by former Chair Traci Rink and current Family Law Section Chair James J. Harrington III. The Family Law Journal is now "state of the art" and in stride with similar electronic publications.

**Family Law List Serv:** Under the very capable leadership of Elizabeth Sadowski, the List Serv is available to a record number of Section members. It is a dynamic and powerful communication tool for attorneys.

**Journal Advertising:** The Family Law Section implemented the "Honor Roll" to permit individual attorneys to financially support the Journal, without having to take out formal advertisements. The "Honor Roll" has significantly augmented the normal advertising revenue of the Journal and the Section is most appreciative of the contributors.

#### QDRO:

The Qualified Domestic Relations Order Committed was chaired by Robert Treat. He was joined in this Committee by Non-Council Members Joseph Cunningham, and Nancy Keppelman. This Committee is assessing the recoupment problems presented by the EDRO Act and possible Amendment to the EDRO Act. Bob Treat has exhibited great leadership and in depth knowledge of the QDRO process which has significantly benefited the Family Law Section.

**MidSummer Seminar:** The Co-Chairs of the Mid Summer Seminar, Traci Rink and Elizabeth Bransdorfer, had an outstanding success with the 2013 Mid Summer Seminar at Mission Pointe, on Mackinac Island. Record numbers of attendees, and record Sponsorship contributions evidenced this success. The wide range of presentations by Judges and Attorneys who were experts on their topics was substantially responsible for the success of the 2013 Mid Summer Seminar.

The Family Law Section is very excited about the upcoming 2014 MidSummer Seminar scheduled for Boyne Mountain Lodge in Northern Michigan. The high level of speakers, cutting edge topics and a family friendly environment promises to make MidSummer 2014 a memorable event.

<u>MidWinter Seminar</u>: This 7 day Seminar in the doldrums of Winter have made this "sun & sand & seminar" event the highlight of the year for many Section members. Once again, Judith O'Donnell exceeded all expectation with this Seminar at Peter Island Resort in the British Virgin Islands from February 1-8, 2014. Outstanding speakers were only exceeded by the spectacular beauty of this exclusive Caribbean getaway.

An equally exciting adventure is planned by Judith O'Donnell for 2015, at the Maroma Resort & Spa on the sugar sands of the Mayan Riviera, Mexico, between January 31-February 7, 2015. This

fabulous trip has "sold out" and all attendees are looking forward with great anticipation to this January getaway.

**Conclusion:** Between now and September there will continue to be dramatic changes in both Legislation and Court Rules affecting the Family Law Section and family law. **Section Committees:** The Health Care Law Section features a Substantive Law Committee with four subcommittees consisting of the Medical Legal Subcommittee, Payors Subcommittee, Providers Subcommittee, and Technology Subcommittee. These Substantive Law Subcommittees are responsible for organizing various educational programs, which typically are given as teleconferences and benefit the Section's membership. In addition, the Health Care Law Section Council has a Publications Committee, a Students and New Lawyers Committee, a Law School Achievement Award Committee, a Legislative Committee, a Technology Committee, a Pro Bono Committee, and Annual Meeting Committee, a Nominating Committee, and a Fellows Committee.

**Publications Committee:** The Committee has engaged in the following whitepaper projects this year: (1) Basics of Starting a Medical Practice from Scratch; (2) Closing a Medical Practice in Michigan; (3) Responding to Subpoenas and Warrants for Protected Health Information in Michigan – Do's and Don'ts; (4) Healthcare Trifecta: Non-Compete, Non-Solicitation and Confidentiality Agreements; (5) CON Basics; and (6) Corporate Practice of Medicine. In addition, the Committee repaired and rebuilt the Section's Legislative Index links and continued to maintain existing publications.

**Students and New Lawyers and Law School Achievement Committees:** The Committee offered "lunch and learns" regarding the practice of health law at all Michigan law schools. These programs were well attended. Each year, the Section provides scholarship awards for the best health law student at qualifying Michigan law school programs. These awards are presented during the Annual Meeting. A "meet and greet" for young lawyers is planned as part of the Annual Meeting.

**Legislative Committee:** The Committee monitored the Michigan health care legislative and regulatory developments on an as needed basis, reporting on such matters to the Section Council. The Committee's activities included monthly updates on the Public Health Code Review Project, an assessment of the Section's interest in HB 5560 (governmental notices), and an assessment of the Section's interest on furnishing comments regarding the proposed amendments to MCR 3.602 concerning arbitration.

**Technology Committee:** The Committee assessed the accuracy of the Section's web page, including quality of scanned materials and timeliness of information. The Committee recommended review of the Publications Policy.

**Pro Bono Committee:** The Committee met with several community groups and organizations that provide pro bono services in an effort to understand their needs and assess potential partnerships with interested members of the Section. The Committee also conducted a membership survey to assess particular pro bono interests of Section members and current member participation in pro bono efforts. Following the survey, the Committee determined to partner with the Veteran's Law Clinic at the University of Detroit-Mercy on a Pro Bono activity. An informational teleconference is planned for June 10, 2014.

**Fellows Committee:** The Section established a Fellows Program in 2011 to honor former Health Care Law Section leaders who have made sustained, outstanding contributions to the Section and the practice of health care law in Michigan. Fellows are recognized each year at the Section's Annual Meeting. The 2013-2014 class of fellows will be selected this Summer 2014.

**Recommendations for 2014-2015 Council:** Continue to provide educational and networking resources to the Section's membership, via programs and written materials. Continue to pursue the Section's support of the Michigan Pledge to Achieve Diversity and Inclusion. Continue efforts to attract new lawyers and further enhance affiliations with Michigan law schools. Continue to work on jointly sponsored educational programs with other sections and associations to reach members with cross over practices. Continue to support the Fellows Program. Continue with Pro Bono efforts.

# **Closing Remarks:**

It has been a pleasure to serve as Chair of the Section this year. The Health Care Law Section is one of the more active sections of the State Bar of Michigan. Its size, programs, and success are due to the countless hours of hard work by section members. In particular, I would like to thank my fellow Council members, officers, Substantive Law Committee and subcommittee members, all committee members and chairs, our dedicated Section Administrative Assistant, Adrienne Nutter, and last but not least, the many volunteers who have contributed so much of their time and talent to the Section. I know our Section will be in good hands this coming year as we welcome Jennifer Benedict as our new Chair.

# **Events and/or Seminars:**

**39th Annual Intellectual Property Law Summer Institute held July 18-20, 2013, at the Grand Hotel, Mackinac Island:** The 2013 Summer IP Institute returned to Mackinac Island. Two hundred forty-five people registered for the event, with 224 actual attendees. This was up from 181 registrants in Traverse City in 2012, and up from the 211 registrants at Mackinac in 2011. Evaluations of the speakers were very positive. The overall rating for the seminar was 6.14 out of 7.0. The Section was particularly excited that the Hon. The Section appreciates ICLE's support for this program.

**IP Overview:** Patents, Trade Secrets, Trademarks & Copyrights in 60 Minutes or Less, held September 19, 2013, in Lansing: In conjunction with the State Bar's annual meeting, the IPLS provided a one-hour seminar that provided an overview of patents, trade secrets, trademarks, and copyrights for non-IP lawyers. The event was free and open to any member of the State Bar. However, attendance was sparse.

# 2014 Spring IP Law Seminar, held March 24, 2014 in at the Kellogg Center, East Lansing:

Our annual Spring IP Law Seminar had 232 registrants and 194 attendees. This was down from 263 registrants/216 attendees in 2013 and 288 registrants/238 attendees in 2012, but up from 225 registrants/190 attendees in 2011. The Section believes that one factor for the significant rise in attendance in 2012 and 2013 was due to changes in the patent law under the America Invents Act. The program included patent and trademark tracks with presentations from the PTO and national practitioners. This year, the Section also reinstituted a student track. It included a panel discussion focused on careers in the IP field, as well as reserved seats at each of our luncheon tables to promote networking between students and Section members. The Section appreciates ICLE's support for this program.

US Patent & Trademark Office, Patent Trial and Appeal Board Roundtable held on April 24, 2014 at Thomas M. Cooley Law School in Auburn Hills: The Section was honored to host judges from the United States Patent and Trademark Office's Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB) at a public roundtable in Auburn Hills. This event was one of several roundtables that the PTAB conducted nationwide. Judges from the PTAB shared information about the new America Invents Act trials (inter partes reviews, post grant reviews, covered business method reviews, and derivations) including statistics, lessons learned, and techniques for successful motions practice. More than 80 people attended. The IPLS also hosted a reception with the PTAB judges following the roundtable. Both events were free to the public.

**40th Annual Intellectual Property Law Summer Institute to be held July 17-19, 2014 at the Grand Hotel, Mackinac Island:** The 40<sup>th</sup> Annual IP Law Summer Institute will be at the Grand Hotel in July, with advanced patent and copyright sessions Thursday afternoon, updates Friday morning, and various topics Saturday morning. The Section is very excited that the Hon. Gerald E. Rosen, Chief Judge, Eastern District of Michigan, and the Hon. Robert Holmes Bell, District Judge, Western District of Michigan, will speak and share their perspectives on IP litigation.

**2014 Annual Business Meeting:** The Section's annual business meeting will be held July 19 at 8:00 a.m. at the Grand Hotel, Mackinac Island in conjunction with the 40th Annual Intellectual Property Law Summer Institute.

# **Other Section Projects During 2013-2014**

**Pro Bono** - Section 32 of the America Invents Act directs the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office to work with regional IP law associations to implement a network of pro bono service programs for individuals seeking patents, but lacking the financial resources to obtain counsel. The Section has taken the lead in facilitating the development of a program for Michigan. Initially, the Section met with significant stakeholders in any pro bono program, including private firms with significant patent practices and corporate legal departments. Based on the positive result of that meeting, the Section organized a steering committee to direct the design an implementation of a program. Currently, the steering committee is selecting a not-for-profit legal service provider to serve as an administrative partner for the program. We hope to launch a program in early 2015

<u>Writing Competition</u> - For the past four years, the Section has sponsored the Michigan Innovation and IP Legal Writing Competition. The competition is open to law students at any Michigan law school, and recognizes original scholarship in the IP field. Winners receive a cash award, publication in the IPLS *Proceedings* journal, and complimentary registration at a Section educational program. At our 2013 Annual Meeting it was announced that Kyle Quigley of Cooley Law School won the first place prize of \$500, Tasha Francis of the University of Michigan Law School won the second place prize of \$300, and Jordan Zuppke of Cooley Law School won the third place prize of \$200.

<u>Social Media</u> - The Section explored the possibility of, and worked towards, engaging in various social media platforms. A LinkedIn page has been considered and discussions with a representative of the State Bar of Michigan regarding LinkedIn took place. Written guidelines were drafted for a LinkedIn page. Various features of the new State Bar of Michigan section page were discussed and discussion questions for the page are being developed

<u>Survey</u> - In order to continue to provide educational opportunities desired by our section, the IPLS Council conducted a survey of our members to evaluate what we have been doing in the past and what changes may be made as we go forward. This review was also important to our longtime partner, the Institute of Continuing Legal Education (ICLE), as it continues to evaluate its seminar activities. The information that has been gathered is being used to help the IPLS Council plan future seminars.

For the seven months ending May 31, 2014, the Section reported revenues of \$14,320.00, expenses of \$4,867.71, and an Ending Fund Balance of \$23,520.59. # **Other Events and Programs:**

We try to engage our membership with programs and events of interest to them and Michigan's international business and legal communities. These **Other Events and Programs** are designed to inform law students and young lawyers in Michigan about international law as practiced in Michigan and to attract them to join our Section.

1. *"Meet & Greet"* events at Michigan Law Schools:

The ILS hosted informal programs at MSU, Wayne State and UDM Law Schools in 2014, during which three ILS members fed law students and discussed practicing international law in Michigan. Similar events are planned for the fall for Uof M and Cooley Law Schools.

2. International Law Session at Young Lawyers' Section Annual Summit: May 31, 2014:

Ad Hoc Committee: The ILS was invited by Carl E. Ver Beek, of Varnum LLP in Grand Rapids to participate in an effort to "Make Michigan the Delaware of ADR": How do we bring more international commercial dispute resolutions to Michigan? What is the appropriate role of the International Law Section in this effort? We formed an Ad Hoc Committee that includes, in addition to Mr. Ver Beek, the past, present and future Chairs of the Section, and to provide expertise and academic gravitas, the Committee invited Professors Troy Harris of UDM Law School and Julian Mortenson of The University of Michigan Law School to participate. With no illusions that Michigan will displace New York, Paris or London as desirable locations with commercial or financial expertise to host international commercial dispute resolutions, the Committee believes ab initio that, if any such initiative is to "have any legs", Michigan needs to lead with a "hook" like manufacturing expertise. More specific goals remain to be defined but might include a State Bar task force and/or enactment of model legislation in Michigan.

The Judicial Conference affords a unique forum for judges from all courts, whether large or small, urban or rural, to discuss issues that affect the citizen users of Michigan Courts ranging from current court practices to pending legislation. **Council Meeting Schedule:** The Council meets the second Monday of each month, except for July. Most of the meetings were held at the offices of Sommers Schwartz in Southfield. Minutes of Council Meetings are posted on the Section's website.

**General Budget and Membership Information:** Through member dues and event fees, the Council generated approximately \$95,000 in revenue for the 2013-14 fiscal year.

Just over \$65,000 is generated by the dues support provided by our roughly 2,000 members (which is one of the largest sections of the State Bar of Michigan). Due to our recent change to our bylaws, non-attorneys are able to join our Section and enjoy most of its benefits. There are nearly 30 non-attorneys who have taken advantage of this opportunity.

Our expenses for the year will be approximately \$75,000. Most of those expenses relate to the printing and mailing of the Section's quarterly Law Notes publication, with the other expenses largely relating to our programs. A small percentage of our overall expenses relate to administrative costs. New initiatives which got underway in the current year will increase projected expenses for the coming years. Those expenses relate, in part, to supporting the new quarterly e-News publication and webinars, as well as coordinating and managing the Section's

presence on various social media sites. The finances of the Section are healthy and additional services are planned to be supported the Section's current fund balance and increased revenues from current and new programs.

**Events, Seminars and/or Webinars:** The Section continues to have numerous continuing education and social programs each year, and this year it added two new programs to its standard offerings. One of these offerings is a seminar offered in the Fall, the "Making Your Case" seminar. This program addresses issues of particular interest to new practitioners in the field. In addition, this year a summer social event was held. That event was a night at a Tiger's Game, preceded by a buffet picnic at the game.

**Legislative Issues:** While the Council rarely takes positions on legislative or regulatory matters, this year the Council endorsed a bill pending in Congress which would alter the way settlements of employment claims would be taxed.

**Recommendations for Next Council:** Continue with the new programs, including webinars and e-News communications, to better engage a broader range of the membership in participating in the development and execution of our programs, as well as in attending our events, and continue to reach out to the membership for participating in the development, planning and execution of these programs. Also continue to provide the programs which the members have consistently reported are highly valued to them, both on the seminar front and through Law Notes. And finally, continue to develop relationships and partnerships with other sections and affinity bar groups to aid in the maintenance and growth of our membership base, and to also enhance the diversity within our Section.

**Other Information:** In addition to continuing to offer various continuing education and social/networking events for the Section as it has over the course of recent years, as well as providing members with its quarterly scholarly and informative Law Notes publication, this year the Section has developed additional programs and services for its members. For instance:

- The Section, in part in conjunction with other Sections, is offering webinars to our members. The first webinar covered domestic partner benefits for same sex couples. Other webinars are planned for the coming year.
- In addition to Law Notes, the Section has started a new quarterly web-based publication, the e-News. This publication is intended to keep members informed of coming events and provide summaries of past events, and to otherwise keep members abreast of Section developments and ways for members to be involved in Section offerings.
- Late this year, the Section also rolled-out its presence on social media by establishing and supporting sites on Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn.
- This past year, the Council also conducted and closely analyzed the results of a comprehensive survey of members regarding the programs and services provided, their value, and options for providing services into the future.

- The webinar programs, social media presence and e-News will not only provide added value to all members, but will also enhance the Section's connections and relevance to members outside of southeast Michigan region and the generation of more social media savvy attorneys.
- As an outcome of this survey, as well as follow-up surveys and reviews, it was determined that many members were interested in redesigning the traditional format for our Mid-Winter Meeting. # Legislative Issues:

The Section remained very active with respect to legislation during the Section's 2013-2014 Bar Year.

# The Section drafted and supported through both public policy position statements and additional efforts, the following legislation enacted by the Legislature:

• SB 31-32. Clarifies the insurable interests of trusts enacted as PA 7 of 2014 (SB 31) and PA 8 of 2014 (SB 32).

• HB 4382 and 4384. Permits Guardians to request DNR orders in a variety of circumstances, enacted as PA 155 of 2013 (HB 4382) and 157 of 2013 (HB 4384).

# In addition, the Section sought to influence and supported through public policy statements the following legislation which remain pending in the legislature:

- HB 5366 Guardian and conservator fiduciary access to digital assets.\*
- HB 5367 Personal representative access to digital assets.\*
- HB 5368 Definitions relating to fiduciary access to digital assets.\*
- HB 5369 Attorney in fact access to digital assets.\*
- HB 5370 Trustee fiduciary access to digital assets.\*
- SB 144 Scheduling hearings for developmentally disabled minors before age 18.
- SB 177 Scheduling hearings for minors before age 18.
- SB 293 Personal representative access to online accounts.\*

\*While the Section supports these statutory efforts in concept, it believes legislation based on the NCCUSL model law would be preferable.

# In addition, the Section sought to influence and took policy positions in opposing parts all or part of the following legislation which remains pending in the legislature:

• Proposed Amendments to HB 4382, 4383 and 4384. Prior to enactment of HB 4382 and HB 4384, the Section opposed amendments to these bills which are contrary to the public policy position previously taken by the Section. It supported HB 4382 and HB 4384.

• SB 465 and 466. Opposed adoption of proposed Uniform Adult Guardianship and Protective Proceedings Act (UAPPJA), (except the portion covered by replacement legislation proposed by the Council which was adopted).

• SB 743. Voluntary Bar membership.

In addition, the Section has reviewed the following legislation or proposed legislation and in some cases has been drafting language. In some cases, the Section has taken a public policy position and in other cases no such position has been taken at this time.

- SB 731 Appointment of funeral representative.
- SB 831 Would extend personal residence exemption for three years after death.

• HB 4013. Would permit exclusion of income from pooled income trusts arrangements from the amount of earned income used to determine eligibility for Medicaid. The Section has supported this legislation by public policy statement.

• HB 4690 Would modify requirements for real estate affidavits.

• HB 4810 Permits continued use of Personal Residence Exemption if resident in nursing home, (PA 40 of 2014)

• HB 5162 Disposition arrangements for decedents.

• MCL 600.308, 600.861, 600.863 and MCR 5.801, MCR 7.102(9), MCR 7.103(A)(2), MCR 7.108(E)(1) and (2), MCR 7.109(B)(1)(b), MCR 7.210(A)(1), MCR 7.210(B)(1)(b) and MCR 7.102. Drafting amendments to MCL 600.308 and the described court rules for purpose of providing that all appeals from probate court will be to court of appeals. This would also require repeal MCL 600.861 and 600.863. The Section has supported this proposed legislation and proposed court rules by virtue of a public policy statement.

• MCL 600.867, MCR 2.614, MCR 5.802 (and other affected rules) including MCR 7.208, 7.209.• Drafting amendments to MCL 600.867, and MCR 5.802, MCR 7.08(D), and MCR 7.209(A)(1), (B)(1),(F)(1); (G)(1) regarding automatic stays for appeals to conform them to rules regarding automatic stays in appeals from circuit courts. The Section has supported this proposed legislation and proposed court rules by virtue of a public policy statement.

• MCL 211.27a (7)(s). Drafting proposed technical amendment regarding uncapping for property tax purposes. Section has supported this amendment by virtue of a public policy statement..

- Proposed directed trustee legislation.
- Proposed domestic asset protection trust legislation

• Proposed amendments to Jury Instructions J1 170.44 & 179.10 regarding undue influence. The Section has made a public policy statement in opposition to this proposal.


