Nominations are made by professors who teach animal law in Michigan law schools. Nominations are reviewed by the Awards committee, which makes a recommendation to Council for a final vote.

Brandi Award: Established in 2000, the award recognizes a person in the legal or legislative profession who has done something notable for animals. It has been awarded to prosecutors, judges, and legislators. The recipient must be based in Michigan. Nominations are made by Section members and reviewed by the Awards committee, which makes a recommendation to Council for a final vote.

Sadie Award: This award recognizes exceptional efforts on behalf of animals from those not involved in the legal or legislative systems. It was named in memory of Sadie, a beloved family dog, who was killed by an intentional act of animal cruelty. Nominations are made by Section members and reviewed by the Section Awards committee, which makes a recommendation to Council for a final vote.

Appellate Practice Section of the State Bar of Michigan Addendum to 2016-2017 Annual Report

Events and Seminars: A summary of the Economics of Appellate Practice Seminar is attached.

Legislative Issues: None.

Court Rules/Policy Positions:

- Recommendation to the Board of Commissioners on ADM File No. 2016-32 Proposed Amendments to MCR 5.801, 5.802, 7.102, 7.103, 7.109, 7.202, 7.203, 7.205, 7.208, 7.209, 7.210, 7.212, and 7.213 (Probate Appeals Amendments): The Council advised the State Bar of Michigan Board of Commissioners that the amendments be supported with a recommendation for two minor amendments: (1) Replace the reference to MCR 5.801(B) with MCR 5.801(A) in the amendment to MCR 7.202(6)(a)(vii), and (2) Combine the proposed MCR 7.202(6)(vi) with the existing MCR 7.202(6)(i) to avoid duplication. The Board of Commissioners adopted the Council's recommendations and submitted included it in their comment to the Michigan Supreme Court.
- Recommendation to the Board of Commissioners on ADM File No. 2015-02 Proposed
 Amendment to MCR 7.213 (Mediation): The Council recommended to the Board of
 Commissioners that the rule amendment should be revised to specifically exclude
 domestic relations appeals. The Board of Commissioners adopted the Council's recommendation and reported it to the Michigan Supreme Court in its comments on the
 proposed amendment.
- Comment on ADM File No. 2014-25 Proposed Amendments to MCR 7.306 and MCR 7.316: The Council commented to the Michigan Supreme Court that mediations in the Michigan Supreme Court should exclude domestic relations cases, for the reasons stated in the previous position taken with regard to ADM File No. 20-15-02; the Council also echoed the concerns stated by Justice Markman in his concurring comments in the Order about the impropriety of ordering mediation in appeals to the Michigan Supreme Court; and, if a case were ordered to mediation, requested that the Court heed to the mediator's recommendation(s) with regard to tolling or extending deadlines.
- Comment on SCAO Form CC 265 (Request for Appellate Counsel): The Council commented to the Supreme Court Administrative Office that it supports the proposed revisions to this form, for the sake of simplifying and clarifying the process for indigent defendants to seek court-appointed counsel on appeal. The Council was also in accord with the Michigan Appellate Assigned Counsel System's reasons for supporting the amendment.

Publications: The Section published three issues of the Appellate Practice Section Journal this term. The winter and fall editions are printed in a traditional manner, but the combined spring/summer edition is electronic-only in an effort to reduce costs. The committee's goal is to include at least two featured articles in each Journal, along with recurring columns: From the

Chair (by Gaëtan Gerville-Réache); Cases Pending Before the Supreme Court After Grant of Oral Argument on Application (by Linda M. Garbarino); Meet the Judge(s) (by Ann M. Sherman and Conor B. Dugan); Selected Decisions of Interest to the Appellate Practitioner (by Barbara H. Goldman); and Recommended Reading for the Appellate Lawyer (by Mary Massaron).

Other Activities/Events:

Court Rules - The Council has approved proposed amendments to MCR 7.209 to clarify the authority of trial courts to stay enforcement of money judgments without a bond, which will soon be submitted to the State Bar as a proposed policy position and then to the Michigan Supreme Court for consideration if not inconsistent with the State Bar's position.

Good Deeds - The Section sponsored a volunteer event at the Gleaners Community Food Bank warehouse in Detroit. Participating with other groups of volunteers from all over the city, appellate lawyers (and family members) worked in teams to fill orders of packaged food items for distribution to Gleaners' partners. Gleaners operates distribution centers in five counties, providing perishable and non-perishable food items to over 500 soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters and other hunger relief agencies throughout southeastern Michigan.

Michigan Supreme Court Historical Society Luncheon – The Section sponsored a table at the annual fundraising luncheon for the MSC Historical Society in recognition of the importance of preserving the history of our highest appellate court.

Ad Hoc E-Briefing Committee - The Section has assembled a dedicated group of Section members to address the readability, accessibility, and technological issues that have arisen and are expected to arise as a result of recent developments in e-filing. The advent of electronic filing and continuing developments in this area of our practice, both in terms of filing and online access to lower court records, continues to be a topic of great interest to the Section and appellate judiciary. Members of the judiciary in particular have expressed great interested in receiving a recommendation from the Council for rules that will take the most advantage of the new technology to improve the administration of justice in the appellate courts. The Committee's ultimate objective is to recommend rules changes to the Council that will accomplish this end.

AWARDS: Stephen H. Schulman Outstanding Business Lawyer Award

The Section established the Stephen H. Schulman Outstanding Business Lawyer Award in 2006, to be presented annually. The award honors Michigan business lawyers who consistently exemplify the characteristics the Business Law Section seeks to foster and facilitate: the highest quality of professionalism, the highest quality of practice, an unwavering dedication to service, ethical conduct, and collegiality within the practice of law. The Section honored Timothy R. Damschroder at its Annual Meeting on October 7, 2016, at Amway Grand Plaza Hotel in Grand Rapids. The Award for 2017 will be presented at the Annual Meeting on October 6, 2017 in Grand Rapids.

Business Courts

The Committee's objectives are to serve as a liaison between the Business Court Judges and the Business Law Section, to serve as a resource for the Business Court Judges, and to assist the Business Court Judges in whatever ways they and the Business Law Section deem appropriate.

Commercial Litigation Committee

The Commercial Litigation Committee assists litigators as well as business and corporate counsel in addressing issues that may lead to or arise in business-related litigation. The Committee sponsors seminars and other programs that address such issues and that are designed to enhance the practice of those involved in commercial litigation.

Corporate Laws Committee

The Corporate Laws Committee monitors and reviews matters relating to corporate law statutes and developments in the law of corporate governance. The committee also works with the Business Corporation Act Revision Subcommittee, which reviews the Michigan Business Corporation Act for the purpose of keeping it current with developments in corporate law and which assists from time to time in drafting and advocating proposed changes to the Act.

Debtor/Creditor Rights Committee

The Debtor/Creditor Rights Committee focuses on issues of insolvency, such as bankruptcy, state law alternatives to bankruptcy, secured lending (Article 9 of the Uniform Commercial Code), and state law exemptions.

Financial Institutions Committee

The Financial Institutions Committee focuses on legislative, regulatory and judicial developments and issues of interest to financial institutions (primarily banks) and their affiliates.

In-House Counsel Committee

The In-House Counsel Committee is committed to addressing the professional interests of in-house counsel by sponsoring continuing legal education programs, informing members about issues of particular interest to them, and offering social and professional networking opportunities.

Law Schools Committee

The Law Schools Committee is designed to promote an interest in business law among students at each of the law schools located in Michigan. The Committee represents a collaborative effort between the Section and the business law societies at the University of Michigan Law School, Michigan State University College of Law, University of Detroit Mercy School of Law, Wayne State University Law School and Thomas M. Cooley Law School. The Committee supports programs initiated by the business law societies within the law schools and provides a forum for networking among law students and members of the Section.

LLC and Partnerships Committee

The Committee remains active in conducting seminars regarding unincorporated enterprises, focusing principally on limited liability companies. The Committee has also assisted in informing members of the bar from other sections as to legislation affecting unincorporated enterprises.

Nonprofit Corporations Committee

The Nonprofit Corporations Committee's principal responsibility is to review and update laws relating to the organization of nonprofit corporations in Michigan. The principal focus has been on the Nonprofit Corporation Act, but it also reviews other legislation, such as bills regulating the solicitation of contributions by charities. The committee also assists with sponsoring continuing legal education programs directed at nonprofit organization issues.

Regulation of Securities Committee

The Regulation of Securities Committee is concerned with federal and state laws and regulations relating to the offer, sale and trading of securities. The Committee also supplies a liaison to the Securities Law Advisory Committee of the Michigan Corporations, Securities and Commercial Licensing Bureau. Activities are designed to inform members of current developments and issues and provide input to appropriate administrative and legislative bodies.

Small Business Forum

The Small Business Forum specifically caters to business owners, attorneys, accountants, and other professionals who work with closely held businesses. The Forum hosts two to three highly productive, time efficient and fun educational events throughout the year. Every event includes a networking portion to mingle with other business professionals.

Uniform Commercial Code Committee

The Uniform Commercial Code Committee monitors developments and issues under all Articles of the UCC and related commercial statutes. In October of each year, the Committee presents a seminar on recent developments in commercial law. Additionally, the Committee prepares an annual survey of case law involving the UCC and commercial law.

PUBLICATIONS:

The Michigan Business Law Journal is published three times per year and is sent to members via U.S. mail and electronically. The Journal is posted on the Section's website.

STRATEGIC PLAN

QDRO Committee Report:

Members are Robert Treat - chair, Joseph Cunningham co-chair, and Nancy Keppelman. The committee met by phone on 1/24/17, 3/1/17, 3/27/17 and plans to meet on 6/1/17. The initiatives are the ongoing pro bono QDRO program through the SBM Access to Justice Program, and possibly amending the Eligible Domestic Relations Order ("EDRO") Act to deal with the problem of unfair recoupment of a participant's benefit when a pension covered by the EDRO Act is divided by EDRO, or possibly a non-legislative solution.

Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer's report is brief, as it was last year. As of the end of the second fiscal quarter (April) the ending balance has increased about \$28,000 from April 2016. This is due to cost controls; mainly the cost savings of sending the Family Law Journal electronically instead of sending paper copies. There remains the ongoing concern of gradually decreasing dues revenue.

STATE BAR OF MICHIGAN FAMILY LAW SECTION FAMILY LAW COUNCIL 20-YEAR REVIEW COMMITTEE FOR DISCUSSION PURPOSES ONLY

May 6, 2017

As evidenced by the recent memorandum of Scott Bassett, Esq., entitled "History of Michigan's Family Court Legislation", and its appendices, it is evident that the concept of a "family court" has received considerable attention in the 20th and 21st centuries. In Michigan it has now been 20 years since the legislation was signed into law on September 30, 1996. The Michigan legislature, in 1996, amended the Michigan Judicature Act ("Act") (MCL 600.151b et seq) to allow, and in fact require, family courts to operate in Michigan. In spite of the family court's existence over the past two decades, there still remains a lack of consensus concerning the specific goals of a family court. There is even less agreement concerning the best vehicle for family case coordination. For example, is family court best described as a court structure, or a court function, or a state-of-mind among court professionals, or all of the above?

There is wide diversity in the jurisdiction of structural family courts, their operations, and the management structure within which they exist. Traditionally, specialized courts in urban jurisdictions have had jurisdiction over different pieces of a family's legal disputes. However, the basic model of a family court is the consolidation of all, or mostly all, categories of family-related legal matters into one court structure. The consolidation of courts into a structural family court essentially has involved merging of the domestic relations court, probate court and juvenile court.

The family division of circuit court was created as a division of the circuit court and organized pursuant to the Act (MCL 600.1001). Each circuit in Michigan was required by legislative act to have a family division of the circuit court (MCL 600.1003). The judges were then placed on equal footing with their contemporaries in circuit court as the legislature stated, "A judge of the family division of circuit court has the same power and authority as a judge of the circuit court." (MCL 600.1005). The legislature also placed the traditional Michigan probate court matters into the family court without amending the entire Probate Code by stating, "A reference to the former juvenile division of probate court in any statute of this state shall be construed to be a reference to the family division of the circuit court." (MCL 600.1009). Operational plans for each circuit were required to be completed by July 1, 1997. (MCL 600.1011(1)). The plans could be modified to make same more palatable to the judges and community. These "local plans", were and are in control of each circuit (subject to the approval by the Michigan Supreme Court) and the legislature specified the type of cases to be included in the family division.

With jurisdiction established, the legislation created the test for when a case shall be assigned to the same Judge. "When 2 or more matters within the jurisdiction of the family division of the circuit court involving members of the same family are pending in the same judicial circuit, those matters, whenever practicable, shall be assigned to the judge to whom the first such case was assigned." MCL 600.1023. The legislature provided considerable detail as to the jurisdiction of the family division.

In 2002 the Michigan legislature required amended plans, and stated a comprehensive goal for each family division plan as follows: "The plan shall describe how the family division of the circuit court will operate in that circuit and how to coordinate and promote that which the

Legislature has described as 'more efficient and effective services to families and individuals.'"

This appears to remain the necessary base line.

Leadership is required to address the issues created when considering family courts. Judge Richard Halloran's leadership of this Council, and the development of this committee, evidences that he has the right attitude, vision, open-mindedness, focus, planning knowledge of industry best practices, active involvement, and a can-do work ethic. Through discussion and analysis of the following ideas, concerns, and/or goals, the courts that focus on their operations from a citizen's perspective will treat people better. Family friendly courts will provide effective service to the public and be friendlier and more accessible to families who need to maneuver through it. Family friendly courts provide access to services that heal and protect children and families whenever possible, and they resolve cases in a timely and efficient manner. To accomplish same, your guidance is necessary so as to develop the recommendations of this Council going forward.

- 1. What is the purpose of the family division of the circuit court?
- Should we have a "One Family One Judge" model for the family court?
- 3. Is MCL 600.1023 functional and effective, as it provides: "When 2 or more matters within the jurisdiction of the family division of the circuit court involving members of the same family are pending in the same judicial circuit, those matters, whenever practicable, shall be assigned to the judge to whom the first such case was assigned."
 - (a) If yes, how are cases assigned to a particular judge?
 - (b) If yes, how are referees/magistrates utilized?
 - (c) If yes, do you believe this is a good model for all jurisdictions?
 - (d) If no, how are cases best assigned in the family court?
- 4. If numbers 2 and 3 above are in the negative, how best do we coordinate (1) the friend of the court, (2) family counseling services, (3) county juvenile officers, and (4) all other state and public agencies that provide assistance to families or juveniles, in order to promote more efficient and effective services to families and individuals?
- 5. Should there be a permanent (non-rotating) circuit court family division bench, elected on ballot separate from judges of other courts?
- 6. How do we best achieve the goal of developing sufficient judicial expertise in family law to properly serve the interests of the families and children whose cases are assigned to that judge?
- 7. Is the current methodology of the assignment of family division judges optimal? How can it be improved?
- 8. What if any problems are there in using district court judges and/or probate court judges in handling certain domestic relations matters? How are these problems best resolved?
- 9. Of the following, what are the <u>most positive</u>, and the <u>least positive</u>, aspect(s) of the family division?

- 10. What other current problems generally exist in the family division(s) of the circuit court(s)? How are these problems best resolved?
- 11. What training should be mandatory for family court judges? Should each new judge undergo a comprehensive training program in family law substance and procedure before assuming regular caseload duties? On a periodic basis thereafter, should such a judge be required to take a brief leave in order to read, write, and take further training?

. The American Bar Association created a model proposal that contained five characteristics a unified family court should have, as follows:

- "The jurisdiction of the unified family court must cover all family related legal matters, from marriage and paternity to delinquency, child protection, and domestic violence.
- The court must help coordinate and manage outside agencies in providing services to families in crises. This includes having liaisons with social service agencies within the court system.
- Optimally, courts should have a 'one judge, one family' arrangement, in which the family
 has a single team of social service workers throughout their relationship with the court.
 Given the understaffing problems of family courts, however, ABA only requires that a
 judge be informed of all previous and pending litigation regarding the family and its
 individual members to consider the full picture in making a decision.
- In addition to agencies and services to help families outside the courtroom, each unified family court must also have a team of counselors, mediators, and crises interventionists to counsel families and enforce decisions. ABA also recommends including community outreach programs in the courts to facilitate the relationship between the family and the court and to educate the public.
- Unified family courts should use technology to properly track families and their relationships with the court. Access to automated information is strictly governed by policy, court rules, and statutes." See "Unified Family Courts – Streamlining Justice for Troubled Families" by Julie Patton. Children's Voice (Fall 1999) page 5-6.

Accordingly, how should the courts in Michigan be organized to face the issues of family courts? The goal of a court dealing with family issues should be more than simply resolving the

particular issues before them. Ideally a family should be left with the skills and access to support services necessary to enable them to resolve subsequent disputes constructively with a minimum of legal intervention. Courts play a pivotal role at the crossroads of legal processes and social service interventions, and the effective case coordination systems are essential to avoid fragmentation of services and misallocation of judicial resources.

As the Family Law Section Council you are tasked with improving the efficiency for the family court system while humanizing the process for the public. What do you suggest to overcome the obstacles to implementation of the type of plan(s) envisioned by the American Bar Association, legislators Michael Nye, VanRegenmorter and Bullard, and others?

Section Committees: The Health Care Law Section features seven standing committees: Substantive Law, Publications, Legislative, Pro Bono, Fellows, New Lawyers and Law Students, and Membership. The work of each of those committees is summarized below:

Substantive Law Committee: The Substantive Law Committee is the Section Committee responsible for arranging educational programs throughout the year, typically presented in a teleconference/webinar format to benefit the Section's membership at no additional cost. Its work is accomplished through four subject matter subcommittees: Technology Subcommittee, Payors Subcommittee, Providers Subcommittee and Medical–Legal Subcommittee. It produced four webinars on a wide variety of health care law topics with others planned for Summer and early Fall

2017. The topics and titles of the webinars are listed above under the heading "Events and/or Seminars."

Publications Committee: This year, the Committee published three new papers:

- Corporate Integrity Agreements: Understanding Compliance Risk and Obligations to the Government' to be published in June.
- "Commercial Audits and Appeals White Paper" also to be published in June.
- And, a comprehensive whitepaper entitled "Representing Physicians in Fair Hearing Proceedings" to be published in July.

The Committee also has continued to promote and streamline the existing online publication resources for HCLS members.

Legislative Committee: The Committee monitored Michigan health care legislative developments on an as-needed basis, reporting on such matters to the Section Council. The Committee's activities included monitoring and reporting on Michigan legislation such as Public Act 499 of 2016 (advance practice registered nurses), Public Act 379 of 2016 (physician assistants), Public Act 22 of 2017 (telehealth services including prescribing and clinical nurse specialists licensing matters), Public Act 359 of 2016 (telehealth services including prescribing), Senate Bill 270 of 2017 (prohibits prescribing Schedule 2 – 5 controlled substance absent bona fide prescriber-patient relationship), Senate Bill 272 of 2017 (prescribing opioids/patient consent form), Senate Bill 273 of 2017 (requires prescribers to provide information on substance use disorder services to patients treated for opioid-related overdoses), Senate Bill 274 of 2017 (prohibits prescribers from prescribing opioids under specified circumstances), House Bill 4404 of 2017 (regulates pain management facilities), House Bill 4405 of 2017 (qualified immunity to pharmacists who refuses to dispense Schedule 2 -5 controlled substances), and House Bill 4408 (mandates parental consent/disclosures when prescribing to a minor a controlled substance containing an opioid, subject to certain exceptions).

Pro Bono Committee: The Pro Bono Committee continues its partnership with the Veteran's Law Clinic at the University of Detroit Mercy Law School. This partnership seeks to pair section members with an interest in serving veterans with the population served by the clinic. The Section sends out reminders about the clinic and its work in conjunction with Memorial Day and Veteran's Day, and publishes information about available training sessions offered through the clinic. The committee is working to establish additional partnerships with similar clinics serving different populations and is in communication with a number of different potential partners to expand the groups the Health Care Law Section works with to provide pro bono services. The goal of the committee is to pair section members with diverse interests with existing organizations that serve the community and to promote awareness of and interest in these groups and the legal needs of the clients they serve. The committee hopes to establish relationships with a number of groups to provide varying opportunities for probono service among Health Care Law Section members and then to serve as a liaison between the members and these various organizations.

Fellows Committee: The Section established a Fellows Program in 2011 to honor former Health Care Law Section leaders who have made sustained, outstanding contributions to the Section and the practice of health care law in Michigan. Fellows are recognized each year at the Section's Annual Meeting. The Fellows Committee administers the Fellows Program, which includes nominating

Fellows for election by the Council, and handling all matters regarding the presentation of Fellows at the Annual Meeting. The Fellows Committee meets periodically to discuss nominations and other matters concerning the program. In 2016, the Fellows Committee nominated, and the Council elected, the following attorneys as Fellows: Agnes G. Hagerty, Marta J. Hoffman, Robert S. Iwrey, Thomas J. McGraw, and John R. Mucha. The 2017 class of Fellows will be selected in early summer and honored at a dinner following the Section's Annual Meeting on September 12, 2017. A list of all Health Care Law Section Fellows is posted on the Section's web page.

New Lawyers and Law Student Committee: As part of its mission to develop new health care lawyers, the Committee hosted a series of well-attended "Lunch & Learn" programs regarding the practice of health law at several Michigan law schools. The Committee also administered the Section's Academic Achievement program under which the Section awards \$1,500 scholarships to law students at eligible Michigan law schools who exhibit a high level of achievement in health care-related law courses. The recipients will attend and be honored at our Annual Meeting.

Membership Committee: Organized several networking events this year. The Committee orients new Section members to the Section and engages Section members through the Section's Twitter account. Key events and milestones included:

Recommendations for next Council:

- Continue to provide educational opportunities to the Section's membership via expert led webinars and educational papers with an emphasis on addressing a diverse array of topics that reflects the diverse practice areas of Section members.
- Continue to expand and emphasize networking opportunities to the Section's membership.
- Continue efforts to increase all types of diversity in the Section's membership and in all of its
 operations and programming.
- Continue to build and strengthen affiliations with Michigan law schools and encouraging law students to become committee members and actively participate in the Section's social and educational opportunities.
- Continue the Section's strong relationship with ICLE including continued co-sponsorship of the Annual Health Law Institute and Section Appreciation Dinner and consider co-sponsoring a mid-year educational event with ICLE.
- Continue to support the Section's Pro-Bono efforts and develop additional opportunities for Members to utilize their expertise to benefit their community.
- Conduct a comprehensive review of the Section's Bylaws and make any necessary changes.

Other Information: It has been an honor and a pleasure to serve as Chair of the Section and to be a part of such a dedicated and hard-working team. I thank all Council members, officers, committee and subcommittee members and chairs, and the many volunteers who contributed so much of their time and talent to the Section this year. I would like to especially thank Mark Kopson and Patrick Haddad for their years of service and leadership on the Council and Mark's advice and hard work as Immediate Past Chair. Finally, I offer special thanks and appreciation to our incredibly dedicated, hard-working, efficient and always positive Section Administrative Assistant, Susan Stokes, and the entire SBM staff, without whose help this year's successes would not have been achieved.

<u>Property and Deputy Director of the U.S. Patent & Trademark:</u> On September 15, 2016, the IPLS hosted Russell Slifer, the Deputy Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Deputy Director of the U.S. Patent & Trademark Office, for a luncheon to recognize the fifth anniversary of the Leahy-Smith America Invents Act. Dr. Christal Sheppard, Director of the Midwest Regional U.S. Patent Office introduced Mr. Slifer. Mr. Slifer provided a presentation and led a discussion of recent events at the USPTO.

<u>IP Law Section Reception at SBM Annual Meeting:</u> On September 21-23, 2016, the Section hosted a reception for attendees at the State Bar of Michigan Annual Meeting at the DeVos Place/Reserve, in Grand Rapids, MI. The reception was generously sponsored by Price Heneveld, LLP. The reception was co-sponsored by the Information Technology Law Section and the Arts, Communications, Entertainment & Sports Section. The reception was well-attended.

42nd Annual Intellectual Property Law Institute held July 21-23, 2016, Mackinac Island, MI: The 2016 IP Institute was held at the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island, returning to the

island after last year's program at the Book Cadillac Hotel in Detroit, Michigan. This year 234 people registered for the event, with 207 actual attendees. This was up from the 172 attendees at the 2015 program at the Westin Book Cadillac in Detroit. Attendance was down slightly from the 228 attendees at the last Mackinac program in 2014. The program included outstanding presentations from nationally renowned speakers on a range of patent, trademark, copyright, and other related topics. Featured speakers included Hon. Kara F. Stoll, Circuit Judge, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, and Hon. Gerard F. Rogers, Chief Judge of the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office, Trademark Trial and Board. Evaluations of the speakers were positive. The overall rating for the seminar was 6.57 out of 7.0. The program included a Women in IP Breakfast and two receptions on the Grand Hotel porch. Platinum sponsors were Cantor Colburn, LLP, Fishman Stewart, PLLC, and Harness, Dickey & Pierce, PLC. The Section appreciates ICLE's support for this program.

2017 Spring IP Law Seminar, held March 13, 2017 in at the Kellogg Center, East Lansing: Our annual Spring IP Law Seminar had 170 registrants and 133 attendees. Registration and attendance was down from the 194 registrants/192 attendees in 2016. Actual attendance was affected by a snow storm on the morning of the event. Programming for the Spring Seminar continued to focus on practical topics to benefit members' practice areas. This included presentations on the new Federal Defend Trade Secrets Act, cybersecurity and privacy, IP asset valuation, and ethics and conflicts of interest in patent prosecution. The luncheon speaker was Prof. Megan Carpenter of Texas A&M University Law School, who presented on disparaging and scandalous trademarks. Scores for the speakers were very solid, averaging 5.99 out of 7.0.

43rd Annual Intellectual Property Law Institute to be held July 20-22, 2017 at the Grand Hotel, Mackinac Island: The 43rd Annual IP Law Institute will return to the Grand Hotel in July, with advanced patent and copyright sessions Thursday afternoon, updates Friday morning, and various topics Saturday morning. The Section is very excited that the Honorable Jimmie V. Reyna of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit will speak, along with a slate of outstanding speakers providing IP perspectives from government, corporate, and outside counsel perspectives.

2017 Annual Business Meeting: The Section's annual business meeting will be held July 22, 2017 at 8:00 a.m. at the Grand Hotel, Mackinac Island in conjunction with the 43rd Annual Intellectual Property Law Institute.

Other Section Projects During 2016-2017:

<u>IP Pro Bono Initiative:</u> The Michigan Patent Pro Bono Project (Project) is a service project of the IPL Section. The Project seeks to address the unmet need for patent legal services in Michigan by matching low-income inventors and innovators with volunteer patent attorneys. The Project was launched in November 2014, and is one of 21 regional programs providing pro bono patent legal services in all 50 states, plus the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.

During 2016-2017, the Project expanded its operations, including:

In its second year of operation, the Project received requests for legal services from 35 persons. Of these, seven were placed with volunteer attorneys and three more were placed with law school patent clinical programs.

David C. Berry, who serves as chair of the Steering Committee, continued to serve on the Board of Directors of the Pro Bono Advisory Council, a not-for-profit corporation that coordinates patent pro bono programs nationwide.

Representatives of the Project have promoted the program to audiences across the state, including: the Small Business Legal Academy 2017 program (part of Detroit Startup Week); the USPTO Detroit Office Saturday Program at Detroit Public Library; the Michigan Inventors Entrepreneurs Coalition, 4th Annual Innovate MI Event in Lansing; 16th Annual Collaboration for Entrepreneurship (ACE'16); and the USPTO Midwest Regional Seminar: "Seminar for Startups: Protecting Your Intellectual Property," MSU Technology Innovation Center, East Lansing.

During 2016, the following firms and organizations accepted pro bono clients through the program: Dobrusin Law Firm; Fishman Stewart PLLC, Ford Global Technologies LLC, Harness Dickey & Pierce PLC, Kreis Enderle, Price Heneveld LLP, University of Detroit Mercy Law School International IP Clinic, and Wayne State Law School Patent Procurement Clinic.

In addition to coordinating with law firms and in-house law departments, the Project has coordinated with other IP legal resources. It has referred inquiries involving non-patent IP legal issues to Creative Many of Michigan, which operates the Lawyers for the Creative Economy ("LCE") program. It has referred clients to USPTO-certified law school patent clinical programs at Wayne State University Law School and University of Detroit Mercy Law School.

Michigan State Bar Excellence in IP Award: The IPLS created the Michigan State Bar Excellence in IP Award to recognize and celebrate the accomplishments of a lawyer who had excelled in the intellectual property field and exemplified professionalism, excellence, and dedication to furthering opportunities and accomplishments in the area of intellectual property. In 2016, Harold W. Milton, Jr. of Dickinson Wright PLLC was the second recipient of the Michigan State Bar Excellence in IP Award. Nominations for the 2017 award are currently being received and reviewed. The 2017 recipient will be announced and presented with the award during the annual IP Law Institute in July 2017.

Judicial Section Annual Report

All judges of Michigan courts of record are active members of the State Bar of Michigan and thus automatic members of Judicial Section. The Judicial Section by-laws provide for a 27 member executive board that consists of nine members from each of the judges associations, Michigan District Court Judges Association, Michigan Probate Judges Association, and Michigan Judges Association. In order to make the judicial conference more inclusive the Section is in the process of amending the by-laws to include no more than three sitting judges of Tribal Courts as ex-officio positions on the Judicial Section. The Chief Judge and/or Chief Judge designee from the Court of Appeals will also be designated as an ex-officio member of the Judicial Section.

The Judicial Section meets quarterly and coordinates among the members the activities of the judicial associations. The Judicial Section also works closely with the State Court Administrator and Chief Justice to ensure and establish efficiencies in court operations and to promote judicial achievements.

Supporting judges and assisting judges during critical times is a important issue for the Judicial Section this year. The Judicial Section is committed to work with the State Bar to provide a strategy to ensure a prompt response for judges if criticized publically in matters where they are required to act such as selling bonds. The Judicial Section is also actively establishing a committee structure which will work on pro-actively pursing topics that are important to the courts.

The Judicial Section is engaged in exploring ways to provide for more effective communication among the members, including a better use of technologies such as website and introducing the role of Judicial Section to all Judges of Michigan Courts.

Finally it's always critical to review and promote appropriate compensation for Judges including retirement and health benefits. Judicial Section looks forward to continue the success between the bench and the bar to successfully promote the sections priorities.

The purposes of this Section shall be to foster and advance the profession of Michigan Marijuana law; study the principles, regulations, statutes and legal developments that affect Michigan Marijuana law; to encourage and promote reforms in the law; to cultivate the science of jurisprudence; to secure the more efficient administration of justice; to serve as a forum and vehicle for the dissemination of specialized knowledge to practitioners engaged in the practice of Marijuana law in this area by fostering networking and communication among members; to coordinate its activities with those of other sections of the State Bar of Michigan whose activities and practice areas are complimentary to those of this Section; to encourage and advocate effective and thorough legal education; to encourage the continued education of the practicing lawyer; and to afford a means of social intercourse among the lawyers of the State Bar of Michigan. To accomplish its goals, the Marijuana Law Section of the State Bar of Michigan may sponsor meetings and conferences of educational value and support the publication of articles that relate to the purposes of this Section.

Legislative Issues

In September 2016, the MLS submitted two proposed resolutions to the State Bar Representative Assembly to modify the rules and/or official comments for MRPC 1.2 and 8.4. The RA adopted the resolutions, and the State Bar has submitted recommendations to the Michigan Supreme Court to adopt the changes. The Court has not as yet addressed the question.

On February 14, 2017 representatives of the MLS made a general informational presentation to the Michigan House of Representatives Law & Justice Committee with an overview of marijuana legalization in Michigan and the activities of the MLS.

The MLS is considering endorsement of The Coalition to Regulate Marijuna Like Alcohol ballot proposal that may be submitted to Michigan voters in November 2018.

Recommendations for next Council:

Starting and leading the MLS has been an honor. In the upcoming years, the Council will have the privilege of educating and leading attorneys and the public in this emerging area of the law. In 2016 and 2017, the legal landscape will be significantly altered by the adoption and implementation of the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act. It will likely take several years for that system to become established. The MLS and its members can have an important role in that development.

The Council sincerely appreciates the efforts of SBM staff members in guiding the MLS, including Candace Crowley, Peter Cunningham, and Jennifer Grieco, as well as many other staff members who have contributed their time and talents.

Other Information:

In September 2016 the MLS made certain amendments to the Bylaws to facilitate decision-making procedures.

The Section sponsored winter coat drives at its first annual conference and the SBM Annual Meeting to help provide much needed protection to our Veterans.

In October 2016, the MLS held its first annual conference over three days at Firekeepers in Battle Creek. The conference was very well reviewed by attendees. Over 175 Michigan attorneys, law students and marijuana industry participants attended the conference. The MLS is actively planning its second annual conference to be held September 7-9 2017 in Detroit.

Membership in the Marijuana Law Section as of April 30, 2017 is 633 members, and the numbers are growing each month.

The MLS has created a periodic Journal, the first edition of which was published in February 2017 and was very well received.

In May 2017, the MLS co-sponsored with MIOWIA a two-day seminar in Lansing on various facets of marijuana defense practice.

The MLS listsery is an active communication resource. Out listsery moderator posts opinions related to marijuana law as they come out and members post questions and discuss issues related to marijuana law.

The MLS also has a Facebook page that links to marijuana law blogs, and the MLS is exploring other social media options.

ADDENDUM TO 2016-2017 ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE PROBATE & ESTATE PLANNING SECTION FOR THE STATE BAR OF MICHIGAN

Mission Statement:

The purpose of this Section is to enhance and improve the practice and administration of law pertaining to probate; trust and estate planning, and administration; guardianships and conservatorships (including planning alternatives); and tax planning.

General Budget Information:

The Section's expenses generally continue to be in line with revenues. As a result, there is no immediate plan to raise dues. A portion of our annual budget, as well as a portion of our fund balance, is allocated as an "amicus brief" fund for expected increases in appeals involving the Michigan Trust Code and other legislative initiatives. The largest categories of expense are: (1) Council meetings; (2) lobbying on behalf of the Section; and (3) support for education initiatives (primarily in conjunction with the Institute of Continuing Legal Education).

Events and/or Seminars:

The Section continues to maintain a strong partnership with ICLE by co-sponsoring, supporting, or otherwise contributing to numerous seminars on various probate, estate planning, and related administration topics each year. The Section also continues to co-sponsor the Probate Certificate Program with ICLE in an effort to assist practitioners, including those who do not belong to the Section, in developing proficiency in the areas of probate and estate planning. The Section does not offer any seminars independent of ICLE, but such seminars are offered live and via webcast. During the 2016-2017 fiscal year, the Section continued to enhance its outreach to Section members and also recruit new members through social and networking events developed by the Section's Membership Committee.

Legislative Issues:

The Section continues to keep as a priority legislative and regulatory initiatives, as well as common law developments, that affect Section members. The Section is both proactive and responsive by drafting proposed legislation and providing comments on legislation drafted by others. The Section employs Public Affairs Associates, in Lansing, as its lobbyist.

The Section either drafted or assisted with revisions to the following legislative proposals which were ultimately adopted into law:

• The Probate Appeals statute (SB 632, PA 186 of 2016; HB 5503, PA 287 of 2016) [all appeals from probate court will now go to the court of appeals];

- Qualified Distributions in Trust (SB 597, PA 330 of 2016; HB 5504, PA 331 of 2016) [limits creditor claims against certain "qualified dispositions in trust"];
- Dower Repeal (SB 558, PA 489 of 2016; SB 560, PA 490 of 2016; [eliminates right by a surviving widow to claim dower];
- Right to Appoint Funeral Representative (SB 551; PA 57 of 2016) [permits an individual to authorize (in writing) another person to make decisions about the individual's funeral & burial (and/or cremation) arrangements];
- Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets (HB 5034, PA 59 of 2016) [provides a structure to allow a fiduciary to have access to certain "digital assets" of a ward, trust grantor, decedent etc. however, the bill as passed is considerably different than what we originally proposed].

The Section submitted public policy positions concerning the following:

- On September 10, 2016, supported modifying the Estates and Protected Individuals Code (MCL 700.1101 et seq.) to adopt certain of the 2008 amendments to the Uniform Probate Code, and making other related changes to EPIC, pertaining to various issues that can arise relating to children who are the result of assisted reproductive technology.
- On September 10, 2016, supported HB 5638 of 2016 with recommended amendments (to allow a testator to exclude a child from the exempt property allowance of MCL 700.2404).
- On October 10, 2016, supported the proposed Addition of MCL 700.2810 (reformation to correct mistakes to conform the terms to the transferor's intention) and 700.2811 (modification to achieve transferor's tax objections) to EPIC.
- On October 10, 2016, supported proposals to amend MCL 700.2502 (to permit notarized wills), 700.2504, and 700.3406 (regarding presumptions of proper will execution).
- On November 5, 2016, supported technical corrections to the Michigan Trust Code (1998 PA 386, as amended) to change MCL 700.7105(2)(a) to add a reference to section 7402 and to amend MCL 700.7815(2) to delete "unless the trust instrument expressly provides otherwise".
- On December 17, 2016, supported revised versions of certain amendments to the Michigan Court Rules contained in Michigan Supreme Court ADM File No. 2016-32 (those rule changes will implement the previously adopted law change which requires all appeals from probate court to be heard in the Court of Appeals).
- On January 14, 2017, supported Michigan Supreme Court ADM File No. 2015-18 with recommended wording amendments to clarify the intent of the proposed revisions to MCR 9.08.

• On March 18, 2017, approved the filing an amicus brief In the Matter of Joseph Vansach, Jr., Michigan Court of Appeals file No. 334732, in support of the appellee's interpretation of EPIC.

The Section supports the following additional legislative proposals:

- The Section drafted a proposal and is pursuing the passage of legislation to revise and coordinate MCL 565.431 et seq. and MCL 700.7913 regarding the information which must be included in a "certificate of trust existence and authority" or a "certificate of trust".
- The Section drafted a proposal and is pursuing the passage of legislation to amend to MCL 700.7103(n) to improve the definition of trust protector.
- The Section drafted a proposal and is pursuing the passage of legislation that would allow the creation of trusts that can hold tenancy by the entirety property by adding a new section to EPIC, tentatively to be codified at MCL 700.7509.
- The Section drafted a proposal and is pursuing the passage of legislation that would relieve the trustee of an irrevocable life insurance trust (that holds no other assets) from the standard trustee duties that apply to other types of trusts.
- The Section drafted a proposal and is pursuing the passage of legislation to modify the Uniform Fraudulent Transfers Act (MCL 566.31 *et seq*) so that it coordinates with the provisions of the Qualified Dispositions in Trust Act.
- The Section drafted a proposal and is pursuing the passage of legislation to amend MCL 700.7302 (with an ancillary amendment to MCL 700.1106), relating to virtual representation.
- The Section drafted a proposal and is pursuing the passage of legislation to clarify the exceptions for uncapping of the taxable value of real property for certain transfers.

Recommendations for next Council:

For fiscal year 2017-2108, the Section's Council should continue to pursue and update the Council's Biennial Plan of Work. The Council should continue its support, monitoring, and pursuit of legislative initiatives that remain pending as of the date of the 2016-2017 Annual Report, including in particular, the ongoing extensive review of EPIC to identify and propose revisions to better address issues which our members have noted and otherwise update that Code to better serve the citizens of Michigan.

The Council also should continue: (1) reviewing legislative proposals pertaining to EPIC and the MTC; (2) its outreach to existing Section members to become active in the Section and on the

Council; (3) seeking new members for the Section through recruitment and interaction with other sections and bar associations; (4) supporting continuing education of the legal profession in the areas of probate, estate planning, and related administration; (5) efforts to educate the public of the benefits provided by trained attorneys and the often false promises offered by commoditization; and (6) assisting in the prevention of "trust mills" from operating in Michigan.

Finally, the Council might consider revisiting and reviving the work done on specialization in light of certain work done by the SBM's 21st Century Task Force.

Other Information:

- The Section continues to review and draft proposed changes and improvements to SCAO forms.
- The Section continues to publish a Journal three times per year with articles of interest to Section members. The Journal is now electronic only, as a cost-saving measure and to reflect changes in the way information is conveyed and used.
- The Section continues to use the "Join a Committee" link on the Section SBM webpage to encourage involvement by Section members.
- The Section has supported sending its Chair Elect and Vice Chair to the State Bar Leadership Forum, and should continue to do so.
- The Section regularly sends Council and other Section members to work with and testify before members of the Legislature on various initiatives.
- The Section regularly discusses practice developments that are occurring in other parts of the United States and how such developments might or should impact practice in Michigan.

SECTION MISSION STATEMENT: The purpose of the Taxation Section is to study the laws and procedures pertaining to the law of taxation and to promote the fair and just administration of local, state, and federal tax laws; to study and report upon proposed, necessary, or desirable legislation; to promote throughout the State of Michigan, the legal education of members of the bar and the public on the subject of taxation by sponsoring meetings, institutes, and conferences; to promote the Taxation Section through outreach programs.

GENERAL BUDGET INFORMATION: The Taxation Section's expenses continue to generally be in line with revenue. As a result, there are no immediate plans to raise membership dues.

SECTION COMMITTEES: The Taxation Section includes the following six committees:

- 1. Federal Income Tax Committee
- 2. State and Local Tax Committee
- 3. Trusts and Estates Committee
- 4. Employee Benefits Committee
- 5. Practice and Procedure Committee
- 6. Young Tax Lawyers Committee

The Committees (except for the Young Tax Lawyers Committee) monitor legislative, judicial and regulatory developments in their respective substantive areas of tax law. The Committees meet regularly to discuss areas of common concern and topics of interest in their respective practice areas. The Committees also conduct seminars and organize educational and networking events for their members.

The Young Tax Lawyers Committee is designed to promote an interest in the area of tax law among new attorneys, recent law school graduates, and law students. The Committee offers educational and networking events for its members.

ANNUAL TAX CONFERENCE: Each year, the Taxation Section holds its annual tax conference in May. The conference brings together national and local speakers on various topics in the area of tax. The conference is co-sponsored by ICLE. This year's tax conference represented the Taxation Section's 30th annual tax conference. The conference was held on May 25, 2017, at the Inn at St John's in Plymouth, Michigan.

SECTION LEGISLATIVE AND POLICY: On November 3, 2016, the Taxation Section Council adopted a policy statement in support of legislation that would improve the Michigan Tax Tribunal's process to promote the fair and just administration of state and local tax assessments. The Taxation Section Council recently adopted a resolution in favor of House Bill

4412, which would improve the operations of the Tax Tribunal. A representative of the Taxation Section Council testified before the House Tax Policy Committee in support of the bill.

EVENTS AND/SEMINAR

• Back to School: Know your Rights (September 14, 2016 in Flint)

This was the second year of the "Back to School: Know your Rights" event which is a free educational picnic targeted for middle and high school aged students and their families. The event was held at the Flint Boys & Girls Club on September 14 at 5:00p.m. The focus of the program was to provide general information regarding students' rights in Michigan public schools. Topics discussed include: Freedom of Expression and Religion, Freedom from Discrimination, Freedom from unreasonable school searches, how to respectfully handle an encounter with law enforcement and what student's rights are with respect to school discipline. Partnership with the ADR Section

The Young Lawyers Section and the Alternative Dispute Resolution Section have agreed to collaborate by creating a program to mentor, coach, and advise YLS members on a volunteer basis, and to provide assistance to those who have questions or concerns about the ADR process.
